## IX. CIVIL- MILITARY OPERATIONS

The following significant developments attributed through the implementation of the following CMO programs:

*b. Moreover, CIVAC programs conducted filled the gaps in the delivery of health services to the populace. The Infrastructure development projects undertaken by line battalions such as the

Kalayaan Barangay Program projects and the ongoing Joint RP-US Military Exercise TALON VISION 08 had alleviated the living conditions of the local populace.

c. PSYCHOLOGICAL OPERATION - PsyOps efforts of the unit were intended to identify issues and sentiments of the people especially in areas within the proximity of project sites.

The CMO thrust of the Brigade is geared towards supporting AFP Internal Security Operations and socio-economic development programs of government. This is apparent in the infrastructure projects undertaken by the construction battalions such as road improvements, construction of school buildings for the Kalayaan Barangay Program program and the concluded Joint RP-US Engineering Civic Action Program (ENCAP). Other major components of CMO were pursued to complement the development efforts relative to the pursuit of peace and progress in the brigade's area of operations. With these accomplishments, the brigade has created positive results by continually gaining the people's faith towards the AFP in particular and the national government in general.

Out of the above stated fund released, the amount of funds obligated as follows:

1) Ten million five hundred ninety two thousand one hundred fourteen pesos (Php 10,592,114.00) for unit MOOE.

2) Four hundred seventy seven million eight hundred seventy two thousand three hundred forty pesos and 20/100 (Php 477,872,340.20) for PA/GHQ/DND/V-LUNA Projects Fund.

3) One hundred fifteen million fifty three thousand seven hundred ninety three pesos and 08/100 (Php 115,053,793.08) for Civil Works Projects Fund.

4) Two hundred forty four million five hundred fifty thousand seven hundred sixty pesos and 24/100 (Php 244,550,760.24) for BCDA Projects Fund. The total obligated funds amounting to sixty nine million three hundred fifty thousand seven hundred forty four pesos and 81/100 (Php 69,355,744.81).

**XIII. ASSESSMENT**

The 51<sup>st</sup> Engineer Brigade, PA has once again accomplished its mission to provide general engineer support to PA units and contribute to the national development program of the government. It has done its modest share in maintaining peace and order and uplifting the socio-economic condition of the people living in the remotest areas in its area of coverage. Though confronted by the presence of CTM in its Area of Responsibility, it has remained committed and steadfast in performing its mandated tasks.

The perennial problem of low percentage serviceability of its mission essential equipment has affected the prosecution of its various vertical and horizontal infrastructure projects. Nevertheless, through the implementation of an effective maintenance program coupled with continuing support from Higher Headquarters, the Brigade was able to maintain the operating condition of its equipment.

The Brigade has accomplished numerous Combat Support Projects that benefited maneuver units of 2ID in Southern Tagalog Region, 5ID in Northern Luzon, 7ID in Central Luzon and 9ID in Bicol Region. These modest accomplishments have contributed to the mobility and survivability of government troops, thus enabling them to attain tactical advantage over the enemy of the state.

At present, the Brigade is expediting the prosecution of various infrastructure projects such as those supported through Inter-Agency Transferred Funds (IATF), Command Directed High Impact Projects and most especially those under the Kalayaan Barangays Program that focuses in the Construction of School Buildings to support in providing quality education for all, the Construction of Water System to provide water for the waterless Barangays and Construction of Farm-to-Market Road that will link the remotest Barangays to the mainstream of the society and subsequently contributes to the socio-economic development of the area and alleviates the living conditions of the residents thereat.

This KBP Projects are implemented in the entire island of Luzon to include the Island Provinces of Masbate, Mindoro, Marinduque and Palawan in support to the Ten (10) Point Agenda of Her Excellency President Gloria Macapagal - Arroyo and to the over-all Internal Security Effort of the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

It has made remarkable achievements through its completed projects. Despite numerous concerns that it has to address such as shortage of personnel and equipment, the presence of CTM armed components and unfavorable weather condition in the project sites; it will continue to march on and fulfill its mandated role in nation building and will remain dedicated in contributing its humble share to achieve lasting peace and sustainable development.

As we go on to pursue our mandate, the Officers, Men and Women of the 51<sup>st</sup> Engineer Brigade shall continue to deliver quality services not only to the AFP but to the entire Filipino nation as well.
