

P50,000 demanded in latest tanim-bala?

Officials at the Ninoy Aquino bound for the United States. could be immediately released after a bullet was found in one of their hand-carried bags.

Airport sources said that they cannot arrest Namba because the couple has not yet filed official charges or even a verified complaint.

The senior couple immediately denied owning the bullet, saying it

was their second time to travel to US. "We both know that carrying bullets in the airport is strictly prohibited, so why would we bring bullets?" they said.

Airports sources told The STAR that they thought that the tanim-bala syndicate had been disbanded, "but it seems they are back again."

Many ranking officials at the airport said that the next admin-

istration should prioritize the reorganization of the MIAA, since its present officials have failed to curb the bullet-planting scam.

Public Attorney's Office chief Persida Rueda-Acosta said the Department of Justice (DOJ) is set to hear the charges of violation of Republic Act 10591, the Comprehensive Firearms and Ammunition Regulation Act, against the Cortabistas.

Boredom made me do it, says Comelec hacker

BOREDOM made him do it, confessed the IT graduate who hacked into the Commission on Elections (Comelec) website and caused a massive data leak of voters' information.

Defacing the Comelec website was meant "to give voice to

the voiceless," Paul Biteng told the INQUIRER in an interview. But the data leak was not part of the plan, he added.

Biteng recalled that it was a "boring" March 18 afternoon at home, and that he was "looking for something to do" aside from playing the usual computer games and reading the news

iline. He was "not a TV pern" and there was no newspar around, so the 23-year-old d what he thought he does st: hack a website.

And then he thought, "Why not face the Comelec website?"

The hottest topic at that time as the Comelec's refusal to enre that the vote-counting maines would have four safety atures and that there would vote receipts during the May elections, Biteng said.

"The government didn't think was necessary to do these ings. But these are safety mearres to ensure that there would no cheating [on Election ay]," he added. "Since I was red that day, I though I should ve voice to the voiceless."

The "operation," as Biteng

fondly called the hacking during the Inquirer interview, began at 5 p.m. that day, a month before his graduation on April 15.

Identities unknown

Cracking the computer codes or spotting the website's "error" took 13 hours. In between, Biteng would smoke outside his parents' house in Sampaloc, Manila, or play computer games. Then the lean-framed, curly-haired student would go back to work.

"I worked hard on this," Biteng said with an occasional laugh during the interview.

On March 20, Biteng shared the codes with fellow hackers, whose real identity he said he didn't know. By March 27, the website had been defaced and the voters' data leaked.

That was not part of the plan, Biteng said. "And that's what bothers me the most. I did not leak the voters' details. I didn't even expect that to happen," he added.

While he feels proud of the operation to deface the Comelec website, Biteng said he regretted the leakage and his subsequent arrest.

"I don't know why (the other hackers) did that because my plan was only to deface the site and get my message across," Biteng said.

Major breach

Initially after the hacking, Biteng said he played it cool and was unfazed by news reports. There was nothing to worry about, he thought, because he didn't leak the voters' data. But when news reports started describing the leakage a "major breach" and "the biggest leakage in history," Biteng started to worry.

He knew then that he would be arrested, and expected authorities to pick him up soon. But getting jailed was farthest from his imagination.

"I'm scared of jail because I'm not a criminal," he said. After a pause, he burst out laughing: "Or maybe I am?"

He added: "But I didn't kill anyone. I'm not an ordinary criminal, I'm just a cybercriminal."

The National Bureau of Investigation arrested Biteng on Wednesday night, and criminal charges were filed against him the following day at the Manila city prosecutor's office. He remains detained at the NBI cybercrime division pending the resolution of the case.

The Comelec, meanwhile, said the website with the leaked voters' data had been taken down.

NPA commanders killed in pursuit ops vs PNP abductors

DAVAO CITY - The 10th Infantry (Agila) Division of the Philippine Army on Thursday confirmed that the two bodies recovered at encounter sites in Sito Bandan, Barangay Lumiad in Paquibato District here were that of high-ranking New People's Army (NPA) leaders operating in the area.

In a statement, 10th ID chief information officer Capt. Rhyan Batchar identified the NPA leaders killed as Bernie Pepito Alima alias King, vice-commanding officer of Andoy Platoon of Pulang Bagani Company (PBC) 1; and Levy Boy Almosara alias Rexan, commanding officer of Basil Platoon, also of PBC 1.

Their bodies were recovered by the troopers of 84thInfantry Battalion during its pursuit operations against NPA rebels who engaged them in the area last April 18 and 19 in Sitio Banban, Barangay Lumiad, Paquibato District here.

Batchar added that the two are also believed to be part of the group that attacked the military detachment in Quiman-anao village on Saturday last week that resulted in the wounding of a militiaman and a

After that attack, the insurgents also abducted a police major and his men who were responding to the incident.

Chief Insp. Leonardo V. Tarongoy, the station commander of Paquibato Police Station, PO3 Rosenie L. Cabuenas, PO3 Rudolf Pacete, PO3 Abdul Azis A. Ali Jr. and PO2 Neil C. Arellano, and civilian driver Ronald Dordas were on board their patrol vehicle en route to Brgy. Salapawan

when they were flagged down in Brgy Mapula.

In the same statement to the media here, 10th ID commander Major General Rafael Valencia said that the death of the two ranking NPA leaders was an indication that "the long arm of the law will, sooner or later, get all those who espouse and use violence to achieve their goals."

"We should all realize that all these social, political and economic problems we face regularly are best resolved in an environment of peace," he added.

The army and the Philippine National Police in Davao region (PNP-11) on Wednesday reiterated that they will never negotiate with any lawless groups and that the intensified pursuit operations against the PNP abductors will continue. (Alexander D. Lopez)



Miranda named acting AFP chief

resident Aquino presides over the change of command from Gen. Hernando Iriberri to the acting armed Forces of the Philippines chief, Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda, during a ceremony at the AFP trandstand in Quezon City yesterday.

President Aquino has appointed Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda as the new chief of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), replacing Gen. Hernando Iriberri who left the service yesterday upon reaching the mandatory retirement age of 56.

Aquino led the turnover ceremonies at the AFP general headquarters at Camp Aguinaldo. Miranda, the vice chief of staff, will be assuming the top AFP post in an acting capacity due to restrictions under election rules that prohibit appointments to certain positions at this time.

Unless the next president extends his appointment, Miranda's term will be coterminous with Aquino's on June 30.

Aquino lauded Iriberri for his exemplary military service, highlighted by the conduct of the peaceful 2013 elections in the province of Abra and the arrest of top New People's Army (NPA) leaders Benito

and Wilma Tiamzon.

Iriberri was also cited by the President for his untiring efforts that brought peace to 52 out of 56 NPAaffected areas around the country, making them ready for peaceful

development.

Iriberri, in his retirement speech, said the recent killing of 18 soldiers in Basilan would not deter the military from performing its mandated task to protect the people and the state against known enemies.

three decades I have mourned the loss of my men. Even then their sacrifices bolster our determination to fight harder. Just 13 days ago, we witnessed the valor of our troops as they made the ultimate sacrifice during an operation in Basilan province. I salute their valor. We shall not be cowed by this incident. Instead, after we have wiped our tears, we shall continue the fight for peace and for our people." Iriberri said.

Miranda, for his part, said that as "A number of times in the last acting AFP chief, his command thrust will be patterned after the operational plans and programs already initiated by Iriberri.

Miranda, a member of Philippine Military Academy "Matikas" Class of 1983, assumed as the AFP vice chief in March, after his position as commanding general of the Northern Luzon Command was swapped with then vice chief Lt. Gen. Romeo Tanalgo.

Before he was Nolcom chief, Miranda served as commanding general of the Army's 7th Infantry Division in

Nueva Ecija.

He also led the Army's 25th Infantry Battalion, 1002nd Brigade

He was also dean of academics

of the AFP Command and General Staff College and later on the General Headquarters and Headquarters Service Command at Camp Aguinaldo.

Miranda is a Scout Ranger, a paratrooper, infantry and intelligence officer. He has a master's degree in National Security and Business Administration.

"As a soldier, I have seen violence and disturbing landscapes on many occasions. In all these occasions, none I would say was ever pleasant and for the lack of softer terms, they all look ugly," Miranda said.

In pursuit of peace, Miranda enjoined all servicemen to be guided

by the military's operational thrusts and guidelines to prioritize goals for attaining decisive wins while at the same time sustaining support for the government's peace initiatives.

As acting chief of the 130,000-strong military, Miranda also said he would continue to push the AFP modernization program while uplifting the morale and welfare of the troops.

"The upgrade of our defense posture and delivery of needed new platforms and materiel, as well as the release of resources for many other projects, came at the most opportune time," Miranda said. – With Jaime Laude

AFP will be apolitical, acting chief vows

THE NEW acting chief of the Armed Forces of the Philippines on Friday rallied the 125,000-strong military to ensure credible elections on May 9 and remain apolitical, calling the elections "one of the country's finest moments."

"Our county is nearing one of its finest moments, the elections, in a few days from now... As oftenly said, the AFP will remain apolitical and will stretch its means to contribute to that end," Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda said in his speech.

President Aquino formally named Miranda AFP acting chief on Friday morning at Camp Aguinaldo as Chief of Staff Gen. Hernando Iriberri retired at 56, the mandatory retirement age in the military and police.

The Constitution prohibits the President from appointing an AFP chief of staff because of the election ban on appointments. This gives the next President a free hand in appointing a military chief.

Even so, Mr. Aquino expressed confidence that Miranda was capable of continuing Iriberri's programs until June 30, when the President steps down from office.

"Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda will be the acting chief of staff. He is known to be analytical and innovative as a strategist and a soldier," he said in a seven-minute-long speech, his shortest yet as Commander in Chief.

Miranda, a member of of the Philippine Military Academy "Matikas" Class of 1983 like Iriberri, will keep his current position as vice chief of staff, military officials said.

Miranda, 54, reminded the military officers and men to be guided by operational guidelines and tasks in securing next month's elections.

"As I emphasized earlier, let us secure the conditions that would lead to the conduct of a free, orderly, peaceful and credible 2016 national and local elections," he said.

Miranda, a Scout Ranger, was the commander of the Northern Luzon Command (Nolcom) before President Aquino named him as vice chief of staff in March.

Mr. Aquino also praised Iriberri for his "professionalism, talent, and dedication" which he said are the "hallmarks of a true soldier."

He recalled that during Iriberri's term as brigade commander in Abra in 2013, there was no declaration of failure of elections in the province and no election-related violence.

Iriberri retires; Miranda designated acting AFP chief

Lieutenant Gen. Glorioso Miranda has been designated as acting Chief of Staff of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) until a new one is

appointed by the country's next president.

In a ceremony held in Camp Aguinaldo, Miranda replaced Gen. Hernando Iriberri who retired from the service on Friday after reaching the mandatory retirement age of 56.

President Aquino, in his remarks, explained that he was

unable to appoint a new military chief due to a constitutional ban on appointments.

Miranda, a member of the Philippine Military Academy class of 1983, was named AFP vice chief of staff last month

Glorioso Miranda, na kilala sa pagiging mapanuri at maparaan bilang strategist at sundalo [Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda, known for being analytical and resourceful strategist and soldier, will be the acting chief of staff]," he added.

Sec. 15, Art. VII of the 1987 Constitution provides that a President or acting President shall not make appointments two months before the next elections and up to the end of his term.

Exempted from the appointment

ban are temporary appointments to executive positions when vacancies would prejudice public service or endanger public safety.

Miranda previously served as commanding general of the Northern Luzon Command. He also became the commanding general of the Army's 7th Infantry Division in Nueva Ecija.

The President, meantime, lauded the professionalism, competence and dedication of Iriberri during the retirement ceremony

Under Iriberri's watch, Aquino said the military has neutralized high value targets such as Moroccan bomb instructor Mohammad Khattab and New People's Army leader Maria Concepcion Bocala.

Aquino said 52 of the 76 provinces affected by the communist rebels' activities have become "peaceful and ready for fuller development."

Of the 52 provinces, 21 have been declared peaceful during the term of Iriberri as Army chief and AFP chief of staff. (Genalyn D. Kabiling)

Help ensure peaceful polls, Aquino asks AFP

RESIDENT Benigno Aquino 3rd on Friday challenged security forces to ensure that the May 9 elections will be peaceful and orderly.

Aquino, the military's Commander-in-Chief, attended a ceremony marking the retirement of Gen. Hernando Iriberri in Camp Aguinaldo in Quezon City on Friday but did not name a successor to the outgoing AFP chief of staff, who turned 56.

Iriberri's mandatory retirement came at a time when appointments are banned because of the local and national elections next month.

Without a replacement for Iriberri, the AFP will be led by an acting chief of staff until the next President names a new one after assuming office in June.

In his speech, Aquino said he is constitutionally barred from appoint-

ing a new AFP chief, which is why Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda is only taking over the AFP in an acting capacity, being the AFP vice chief of staff.

But the President expressed confidence that Miranda will continue Iriberri's program, especially for peaceful elections.

"Ngayon nga po, bagaman hindi na tayo makakapagtalaga ng Chief of Staff dahil sa mga pamantayan ng Saligang Batas, tiwala pa rin tayo na ang papalit kay General Iriberri ay maipagpapatuloy ang maganda niyang nasimulan, sa nalalabing mga buwan ng ating termino [While I cannot appoint a Chief of Staff because of the constitutional prohibition, I am confident

that the successor of General Iriberri will continue the good things that he had started, in the remaining months of my term]," Aquino said.

"Magiging acting Chief of Staff si It. Gen. Glorioso Miranda, na kilala sa pagiging mapanuri at maparaan bilang strategist at sundalo [Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda, who is known as a thorough strategist and soldier, will be the acting Chief of Staff]," he added.

In response, Miranda assured that the military will remain apolitical in the May 9 elections.

"Our country is nearing one of its finest moments, national and local elections a few days from now. Your AFP is committed to achieving orderly and peaceful conduct of these coming elections," said Miranda, who assumed his post 17 days before the polls.

"As oftenly said, the AFP will remain apolitical and stretch its means to contribute to this end," he added.

Miranda, Iriberri's Philippine Military Academy 1983 classmate, was former commander of the AFP's Northern Luzon Command (Nolcom).

Before he was Nolcom chief, he had served as commanding general of the Army's 7th Infantry Division in Nueva Ecija province.

He also led the Army's 25th Infantry Battalion, 1002nd Brigade.

Miranda was also a Dean of Academics of the AFP Command and General Staff College and later on the General Headquarters and Headquarters Service Command at Camp Aguinaldo, the military's general headquarters located in Quezon City.

A Scout Ranger, a paratrooper, an infantry and an intelligence officer, he has a master's degree in National Security and Business Administration.

Miranda is the 7th and final AFP chief appointed by Aquino, who steps down on June 30.

Former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo had 11 chiefs of staff in her nine years in office.

7 Marines wounded in clash with

Sayyaf

ZAMBOANGA CITY - At man for Western Mindanao Comleast seven Marines were wounded in an encounter with the Abu Sayyaf yesterday in Sulu.

The soldiers were on a search and rescue mission for kidnap victims.

Maj. Filemon Tan Jr., spokes-

mand (Westmincom), said specialized forces ran into the bandit group led by Hairullah Asbang in the vicinity of Barangay Tugas, a mountainous village in Patikul town at about 11 a.m.

Tan said the troops of the Spe-

cial Operations Command (SOC) 10 and 62nd Marine Company fought it out with the Abu Sayyaf for an hour.

He said the enemy side suffered casualties but an exact number could not be determined as

the bandits retreated to the forest.

There was no immediate sighting of any hostages during the encounter.

The clash occurred as the military intensified search and rescue operations to prevent the Abu

Sayyaf from harming its captives following an ultimatum that lapses on Monday if the demand of P300 million each for the Samal captives is not met.

Canadians John Ridsdel, Robert Hall, Norwegian Kjartan Sekkingstad and Filipina Marites

Flor were kidnapped on Sept. 21 in Samal Island in Davao.

Aside from the four captives, the Abu Sayyaf was also believed to be holding a Dutch national, 14 Indonesians, four Malaysians, a Chinese woman and six Filipinos.

AFP mum on US air patrol over By JAIME LAUDE Scarborough

Philippines (AFP) remains tightlipped over the recent flying mission conducted by the US air contingent in the vicinity of Panatag (Šcarborough) Shoal.

A number of senior military officials who attended yesterday's AFP change of command at Camp Aguinaldo all declined to comment on the recent US air sortie.

"We don't have any knowl-

The Armed Forces of the edge about it," said two of the senior officials, whose respective units have air and maritime jurisdictions over the entire West Philippine Sea and South China Sea.

Northern Luzon Command (Nolcom) commander Lt. Gen. Romeo Tanalgo also declined to comment on the recent US air patrol near Panatag Shoal.

Tanalgo's unit has overall command of the entire mili-

tary in the country's northern front.

On the other hand, Undersecretary and former AFP chief Emmanuel Bautista was seen at Camp Aguinaldo discussing things with an unnamed Chinese military defense attaché.

The two were standing near the AFP Public Affairs Office and seen talking to each other after attending the AFP com-

mand turnover, an event presided over by President Aquino.

On Tuesday, the US Air Force said it has dispatched an attack aircraft, along with its primary combat search and rescue helicopters, for an air mission in international airspace but within the vicinity of Panatag Shoal.

S/Sgt. Benjamin Stratton of the Pacific Air Forces Public Affairs (PAFPA) said USPACOM's

Air Contingent operations at Clark Air Base involved four A-10Cs Thunderbolts and two HH-60G Pave Hawks.

"The A-10s and HH-60s conducted a flying mission through international airspace in the vicinity of Panatag Shoal west of the Philippines providing air and maritime situational awareness. These missions promote transparency and safety of movement in international waters and airspace," Stratton' said in a statement yesterday.

He said the aircraft are part of the "Air Contingent in the Philippines" specifically to conduct operations ranging from air and maritime domain awareness, personally recovery, combating piracy and to assure all nations have access to air and sea domains throughout the region in accordance with international



SWIMMING AGAINST THE CURRENT

Getting started on a transformation journey

It took some time, however, before it decided to start on its transformation journey. This has been, in part, due to the size and complexity of the AFP organization: a decision of such a strategic character — such as that of embarking on a transformation journey — should be taken with a lot of discernment and cautionary prudence. To be fair, the AFP was being nudged towards adapting the PGS, which in effect is the Philippine version of the balanced scorecard, since the early part of 2010.

The outgoing administration celebrated the agreement the Philippines was able to forge with the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) of the US. It secured a "partner status" after the Philippines demonstrated that six national government agencies (NGAs) had embarked on a good governance (anti-corruption) program, which had

The partnership agreement with the MCC was formally signed, after the new administration had taken office in the second half of 2010.

- The Office of the President had issued a Memorandum Order expanding the coverage of the good governance program beyond the original six NGAs. Since the Philippine Navy had started on such a program before this Memorandum Order was issued, the Office of the President included the AFP, the Philippine Army, and the Philippine Navy in the expanded list of NGAs encouraged to go through the PGS-balanced scorecard good governance program.

– On the basis of such an encouragement from the Office of the President, the Philippine Army decided to formulate and then execute an Army Transformation Program. This soon started to deliver good results, which were promising of future transformation of the Army. Given the relative size and importance of the Army within the AFP structure, the positive developments that were beginning to happen in the Army could not escape the notice of the general headquarters, and thus of the AFP.

Before the AFP finally decided to get started with its own transformation program, it had internalize — and fully understand as well as appreciate — the three basic demands of the PGS-balanced scorecard good governance program. And it had to make a determination that in fact these basic demands would meet some, if not most, of the felt-needs of the AFP. It soon came to increasingly realize that the following demands would help address some of its basic needs:

– A good governance program is all about the long-term strengthening and further development of the institution as a whole. The focus is on the long term, i.e. over a stretch of many years. In the case of the Army, the decision was to take the entire period between 2010 and 2028. The AFP decided to adopt this same long-term perspective. It recognized that to further strengthen and develop the



at some foreseeable future, it would take many years. This has many advantages, not the least of which is to untie any possible connection of the progress of the AFP transformation program with the much shorter political cycle (with every Administration limited only to six years).

- Good governance is much less about personalities, and so much more about the entire institution as such, in this case the AFP. Taking into account the fast turn-over of the AFP chiefs of staff, whose terms of service have been kept short by current Philippine law (as inspired by the Philippine Constitution), the importance of personal legacy projects that individual AFP chiefs of staff may be inclined to focus on is reduced to relative insignificance compared to the much greater focus on those initiatives and programs for the long-term development and strengthening of the AFP as a whole.

- A governance system is comprehensive in its coverage and concerns. It covers the skills and motivation of personnel; the efficiency of internal core processes; the service to the general public and the perception the public may have of the AFP; the financial constraints; and finally the socio-economic impact of AFP programs and strategies. Budgets and fund sources are only one of five critical facets that a governance program covers. Moreover, all policies and programs - including all doctrines and operating systems - need to be properly interconnected with each other in mutually reinforcing fashion. Alignment, as the AFP would soon find out, is key to the success of a governance and transformation program.

These demands can be mindboggling for an organization as big and complex as the AFP. But after due deliberation, and with an eye trained on what the Army was beginning to experience, the AFP finally made a decision: in 2012, it decided to start on a good governance and transformation nourney, adopting the PGS-balanced

NEW LEADERSHIP II Miranda replaces Iriberri on military's top post



Camp Aguinaldo, Quezon City, DWDD — On April 22,

2016, General Hernando DCA Iriberri, Armed Forces of the Philippines Chief of Staff, has formally retired from military service in a Change of Command and Retirement Ceremonies at Camp General Emilio Aguinaldo on the same day of his 56th birthday. The said ceremony was attended by President Benigno S. Aquino III, Defense Secretary Voltaire Gazmin, and DILG Secretary Senen Sarmiento and othey key officials in the government.

Iriberri relinquished his post after serving for about nine months since his assumption in July 10, 2015.

In the said ceremony, President Aquino, commander-in-chief, appointed Lieutenant General Glorioso Miranda, former AFP Vice Chief of Staff, as the new AFP Chief of Staff. His acting capacity is because Iriberri's mandatory retirement came at a time when appointments are banned due to elections.

Prior to his position, Miranda served as the 26th Commander of the Northern Luzon Command of the AFP (NOLCOM) and Commander of the 25th Infantry Battalion during the Army's all-out war against the southern secessionists. He was also a Dean of Academics of the AFP Command and General Staff College and later on the General Headquarters and Headquarters Service Command at Camp Aguinaldo. Miranda also served as a Scout Ranger, a Paratrooper, and an Infantry and Intelligence officer with commando training in the United Kingdom.

During the turnover ceremony, Lt. Gen Miranda said that the military will assure that the May 9 elections will be peaceful and orderly.

He also vowed to continue to pursue undesirable elements that disturb the balance and sow terrorism in the country.

Miranda also added that the AFP, under his watch, will continue to fight for peace. "Peace is not a destination, but a continuing journey.", the new acting Chief of Staff said on Friday.

In his valedictory speech, outgoing AFP Chief Iriberri expressed his gratitude to the people who has helped him through the years of his military service including Pres. Aquino, , and most especially the members of the Armed Forces of the Philippines.

Iriberri also expressed his sadness over the death of the 18 soldiers during the Basilan Encounter last April 9. He also said that he salutes their sacrifice in name of service to the country.

He mentioned that throughout his military service, he only applied one leadership principle, and that is in order to be a good leader, one must learn to understand the people and the situation.

Before the ceremony ended, Pres. Aquino, in his closing address, proudly stated the improvement of the Armed Forces of the Philippines under his term such as augmentation in the soldiers' allowance, additional housing units for the soldiers, and the overall modernization of the AFP.


The President ended his speech by saying, "The Filipino is definitely worth dying for."

MANILA, Philippines - (UPDATE, 5:57PM) President Benigno Aquino III attended the parade marking the retirement of General Hernando Iriberri in Camp Aguinaldo on Friday but did not name a successor to the outgoing Armed Forces of the Philippines chief of staff, who turned 56.

There had been talk that Irriberi might be given an extension of his term by Aquino, who himself is winding down his six-year presidency.

Iriberri is facing criminal and administrative charges before the Office of the Ombudsman over the scrapping of two high-explosive ammunition contracts worth P97.8 million and a separate arms smuggling case.

Without a replacement for Iriberri, the AFP will be led by an acting chief of staff until the next president names a new one after assuming office.

The President, meanwhile, designated Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda the Acting Chief of Staff.

Miranda is a member of the Philippine Military Academy (PMA) "Matikas" Class of 1983.

When Aquino assumed office in 2010, he refused to recognize the late General Delfin Bangit, who had been appointed AFP chief by former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo in March that year. Bangit nipped the controversy by going into early retirement in June.

Acting AFP chief orders all military members to comply with directives securing May 9 polls

MANILA, April 22 (PNA) --- As he formally assumes command of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) albeit in an acting capacity, Lt. Gen. Glorioso Miranda ordered all officers and enlisted personnel to comply with the directives issued to ensure the coming May 9 elections.

"As I emphasized earlier, let us secure the conditions that would lead to the conduct of a free, orderly, peaceful and credible 2016 national and local elections," he added.

The same directives also calls for the 125,000-strong AFP to remain apolitical and non-partisan.

As this develops, Miranda said operations against rebel and terrorist groups in Mindanao would continue until all these threats were neutralized.

These groups are believed to be responsible for a series of kidnapping incidents and bloody clashes in the region.

"Around the countryside, particularly in our southern territories, we will relentlessly pursue undesirable elements that continue to sow terror among our peace-loving citizens, those who disturb the balance that provide the platform for economic growth and development," he said.

The acting AFP chief also thanked President Aquino for supporting the AFP modernization program, which led to many completed procurement under newly-retired Gen. Hernando DCA Iriberri's term.

It was during Iriberri's nine months that the two supersonic FA-50PH lead-in fighter jets and new combat helicopters were delivered to the Philippine Air Force, the arrival of 100 armored personnel carriers for the Philippine Army and three landing craft heavies (LCHs) for the Philippine Navy.

But Miranda said equipment did not automatically translate to capability as there was still the need to improve capability acquisition and resourcing.

He added that the AFP should expand its modernization in the realm of international defense and security engagements. (PNA) RMA/PFN

US aircraft conducts 1st maritime situational awareness flight in Clark

MANILA, April 22 (PNA) -- Four A-10C "Thunderbolt" IIs and two HH-60G "Pave Hawks" conducted their first maritime situational awareness flight out of Clark Air Base in Pampanga last April 19, the US Embassy in Manila said.

The aircraft are part of the US Pacific Command's Air Contingent deployed to Clark Air Base.

The deployment of the aircraft, which have remained behind in the Philippines after participating in "Balikatan" 2016, will include conducting operations such as air and maritime domain awareness,

personnel recovery, combating piracy, and helping to assure that all nations have access to air and sea domains throughout the region in accordance with international law.

All operations and deployments are planned and executed with the consent and cooperation of the Philippine government.

The maritime situational awareness operation took the A-10s and HH-60s through international airspace to the west of Luzon.

Missions such as this one promote transparency and safety of movement in international waters and airspace, and showcase the US commitment to ally and partner nations as well as to the Indo-Asia-Pacific region's continued stability.

"Inter-operability with the Philippine military is at the forefront of our mission," Air Contingent head Col. Larry Card said.

"The standup of the Air Contingent promotes this collective focus as we build upon our already strong alliance, and reaffirm our commitment to the Indo-Asia-Pacific region."

All personnel in this deployment are airmen assigned to various Pacific Air Forces bases, and include aircrew, maintainers, logistics and support personnel. (PNA) JMC/PFN
