

China accuses Phl of political provocation

WASHINGTON – China has accused the Philippines of "political provocation" in seeking international arbitration over territorial claims in the South China Sea.

Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi said Thursday the decision by Philippine leaders to lodge a case with a tribunal in The Hague was "irresponsible to the Filipino people and the future of the Philippines."

China has refused to participate in the proceedings. A ruling is expected later this year, after the tribunal decided last October that it could hear the case

The Philippines initiated arbitration in early 2013 after Beijing refused to withdraw

its ships from a disputed shoal under a US-brokered deal. It contends that China's massive territorial claims in the strategic waters do not conform with the 1982 UN Convention on the Law of the Sea and should be declared invalid. The Philippines also asserts that some Chinese-occupied reefs and shoals do not generate, or create a claim to, territorial waters.

Wang blamed the Philippines for shutting the door to negotiations with China over their dispute and seeking arbitration without China's consent.

He said China was prepared to negotiate "tomorrow."

"We are neighbors just separated by a narrow body of water," Wang told the Center for Strategic and International Studies think tank. "We want to contribute to the Philippines' economic development."

Wang was in Washington this week for talks with his

counterpart, Secretary of State John Kerry. Differences over the South China Sea have strained US-China relations. The US accuses China of militarizing a key conduit for world trade. China says Washington and its allies are responsible for raising tensions.

China has conducted a massive program of land reclamation over the past two years in the South China Sea, where Brunei, Malaysia, Taiwan and Vietnam also have claims.

Adm. Harry Harris Jr., commander of US forces in the Pacific, told Congress this week that China has constructed more than 3,000 acres (1,210 hectares) of artificial land there in little more than two years, compared with about 115 acres reclaimed by the other claimants in more than 45 years.

Wang said China has stopped reclaiming land but

other countries are continuing.
Wang also said China's
military facilities on islands

military facilities on islands and reefs are needed for self-defense as other nations have already militarized surrounding shores. China also intends to build civilian infrastructure like weather stations and emergency harbors for ships in danger, he said, which would benefit the international community.

In Manila, the presidential palace refused yesterday to dignify the accusation of foreign minister Wang that the Philippines engaged in "political provocation" when it lodged an arbitration case before the Permanent Court of Arbitration in the Hague.

"The Philippine government respects the independence of the processes of the tribunal; hence, we deem it inappropriate to engage other parties in argumentative discussion while we await the outcome of our petition before the tribunal," Presidential

Communications Operations Office Secretary Herminio Coloma Jr. said.

Meanwhile, reports from Canberra said Chinese officials were "seriously concerned" by an Australian strategic evaluation of the South China Sea and warned Australia against compromising the stability of the Asia-Pacific region.

Australia announced a 20year plan Thursday to bolster its naval strength with more submarines and warships as part of a military buildup it said was needed to maintain peace in the region.

The strategic document, the Defense White Paper, said Australia was "particularly concerned by the unprecedented pace and scale of China's land reclamation activities" in the South China Sea.

While not taking sides on competing territorial claims, Australia opposed "the use of artificial structures in the South China Sea for military

purposes" and the assertion of maritime rights not recognized by international law.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Hua Chunying told a press conference later Thursday that China was "seriously concerned about and dissatisfied with the White Paper's negative statement on issues concerning the South China Sea and the development of China's military strength."

Chinese Defense Ministry spokesman Col. Wu Qian appeared to warn Australia against following the United States' lead by sailing near one of the Beijing-controlled islands in the Paracel chain.

"We urge the Australian side to cherish the hard-won good momentum of development in bilateral relations and don't take part in or conduct any activities that may compromise the stability of the region," he said.

"The military alliance between Australia and the US

should get rid of the Cold War mentality," he added. Chinese officials use the phrase "Cold War mentality"\" to refer to thinking that harks back to an era when the world was less integrated.

Asked for comment about the document, the Chinese embassy on Friday referred the AP to the two officials'

comments.

The document also said the United States will remain the pre-eminent global military power and will continue to be Australia's most important strategic partner over the next two decades.

A major conflict between the United States and China was unlikely, but friction between the two powers over the East China and South China Seas could raise tensions, it said.

"It will be important for regional stability that China provides reassurance to its neighbors by being more transparent about its defense policies," it said. — AP, Aurea Calica

'Congress' failure to pass BBL may fuel extremism'

The failure of Congress to pass the Bangsamoro Basic Law (BBL) could attract the youth to extremism, the Third Party Monitoring Team (TPMT) warned yesterday.

TPMT chairman and spokesman Alistair MacDonald made the warning as he led the presentation of its third annual public report on the peace process.

"The TPMT remains confident that the prize of peace can be attained, since no administration can afford to ignore the costs of conflict in Mindanao – the human costs, the developmental costs, the security costs or the risk of worsening a climate conducive to the spread of violent extremism," MacDonald said.

He said the past year has been a difficult one for the peace process after the failure of Congress to pass the BBL because of the killing of 44 policemen in Mamasapano, Maguindanao

"The past year has been a difficult one, with the tragic events at Mamasapano casting a dark shadow over the peace process throughout the year, and with Congress being unable to complete its deliberations on the BBL," MacDonald said.

MacDonald stressed the failure of Congress to complete its deliberation and non-passage of the BBL dealt a major blow to the peace process.

"Nevertheless, the failure of this Congress to complete its deliberations on the BBL has meant that confidence in the peace process among the wider Moro community has taken a knock, and that this setback, with its attendant frustration, could increase the risk that

some young people may become more attracted to violent extremism - against which risk the most effective vaccination in a successful conclusion to the peace process," he said.

MacDonald stressed the need to sustain public confidence in

the peace process.

The TPMT was formally established in 2013 as part of the peace process between the Philippine government and the Moro Islamic Liberation Front.

There has, however, been significant progress in a number of areas, including for example the successful completion of the first ceremonial stage of decommissioning on June 16, or the completion of the work of the Transitional Justice and Reconciliation Commission," MacDonald said.

MacDonald also noted there has been an upswelling of both domestic and international support for the peace process.

"And most importantly, both parties have remained fully engaged in the process," Mac-Donald said, citing the meeting of both panels in Kuala Lumpur last month.

MacDonald said it is essential to build a path forward so that the next administration can hit the ground running and to work to sustain public confidence in the peace process during this period of transition.

MacDonald said the Framework Agreement on the Bangsamoro (FAB) and the Comprehensive Agreement on the Bangsamoro (ČAB) will remain as the cornerstone of peace.

"It will be the responsibility

of the next administration and the next Congress to bring this process to a successful conclusion," he said.

MacDonald reiterated that ending the decades-long conflict cannot be accomplished

overnight.

He said the Mamasapano incident has also impacted negatively on public and political attitudes toward the peace process and significantly delayed and colored the congressional deliberations on the BBL.

"In that climate, this Congress was not able to complete its work on the BBL, so the torch of peace will have to be taken up by the next administration and

Congress," he said.

MacDonald said substitute bills produced by the House and Senate committees were in a number of respects non-

compliant with the CAB.

"This is an issue which will need to be taken up by the next Congress, when it carries forward its responsibility of legislating for the implementation of the CAB," he said.

While Congress failed to pass the BBL, MacDonald said there has been significant progress in a number of areas during the

past 12 months.

This includes the first ceremonial stage of decommissioning of rebel weapons and forces on June 16, underlining the MILF's determination to fully comply with its commitments under the CAB.

He said that there were also significant if less visible developments in other aspects of normalization, in preparing support for former combatants and their communities.

Japan to provide Phl with war-fighting gear

Japan and the Philippines are to sign an agreement as early as next week to promote technological cooperation, a move that would allow Tokyo to transfer some war-fighting equipment to Manila.

The two governments have been holding working-level talks on the matter since a broad agreement was reached at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit in November last year, NHK reported.

The deal is the first of its kind between two Asian countries, although Japan has a similar standing agreement with the US, Australia, Britain and France.

Manila has shown an interest in adopting training aircraft used by Japan's Maritime Self-Defense Force, with an eye toward surveillance and patrol activities in the South China Sea as the Philippines continues to be locked with China in a sovereignty dispute over several islands.

Observers say the Japanese government is apparently aiming at keeping China in check after the latter reclaimed a disputed island, built an airstrip and installed radar systems and surface-to-air missiles.

In late November, Manila and Tokyo broadly agreed on a pact for the transfer of defense

equipment and technology, a move likely spurred – at least in part – by mutual concern over Beijing's massive landreclamation projects.

Once inked, the pact would allow Tokyo to send Self-Defense Forces equipment to the Philippines.

Despite being one of the most vocal opponents of Beijing's territorial claims in the South China Sea, Manila is considered ill equipped to challenge China's moves and has looked both to Tokyo and Washington in an effort to alleviate this shortcoming.

Japan has already agreed to supply the Philippines with a low-interest loan to purchase a fleet of 10 patrol vessels and has reportedly received requests from President Aquino for larger coast guard patrol vessels and PC-3 submarine-hunting planes.

Media reports have also said that Japan hopes to donate three used Beechcraft TC-90 King Air aircraft, which it uses to train military pilots and can be fitted with basic surface and

3 soldiers, 42 militants killed in Lanao Sur clashes

Three soldiers and 42 militants have been killed as security forces continued their offensive against militants in Butig, Lanao del Sur.

"Our troops seized the stronghold of the terrorists yesterday. Sadly, three were killed and 11 wounded in action," Maj. Felimon Tan Jr., spokesman for the Western Mindanao Command, said, referring to government troops.

The military operations started on Saturday after the

ZAMBOANGA CITY - militants attacked an Army detachment in Barangay Bayabao that left two soldiers dead and six others wounded. The clashes spilled over to Barangay Poktan and displaced several villagers.

Tan said brothers Omar, Abdulah and Maide Maute led the group of militants believed to have links with Jemaah Islamiyah, the regional terror cell affiliated with al-Qaeda.

Citing intelligence reports, Tan said Omar was among those killed while Abdullah

and Maide were wounded.

Tan said armored personnel carriers were utilized during the operations.

Troops recovered a homemade Barrett .50-caliber sniper rifle and two M16s at the scene.

In a statement released by the Office of the Presidential Adviser on the Peace Process, Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) spokesman Von Al Haq said they received reports that

the militants had identified themselves as members of the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria.

"We are very sad about the attacks in Lanao del Sur. We do not have anything to do with that. We make sure not to destroy our ceasefire agreement with the government," Al Haq said.

Al Haq said they put up an evacuation center in Barangay Sandab for civilians caught in the crossfire.

"There are facilities. There are schools and other houses where the evacuees could seek temporary shelter," Carlos Sol Jr., head of the government Coordinating Committee on the Cessation of Hostilities Secretariat, said of the evacuation center.

Sol said the MILF also repositioned its forces to prevent a misencounter with government forces.

In a separate statement, MILF commander Abdullah Macapaar urged the joint ceasefire committee to conduct an investigation into the attacks.



42 terrorists Slain

Government troops capture group's Lanao del Sur stronghold

overnment security forces have killed at least 42 members of a Jema'ah Islamiyah (JI)- affiliated local terror group and captured their stronghold

during six days of fighting in Butig, Lanao del Sur, the military said yesterday

Maj. Filemon Tan, spokesman of the Armed Forces of the Philippines-Western Mindanao Command (AFP-Wesmincom), said three soldiers were

also killed and 11 wounded in clashes that started Saturday last week.

"Nakuha na ng tropa ang stronghold ng mga terrorista kahapon bago magdilim (Our troops were able to seize a stronghold of the terrorists before dusk on Thursday)," said Tan. "Sadly, we have three soldiers killed in action (KIA) and 11 wounded in action (WIA), while intelligence reports show that more or less 42 were killed from the enemy," he added.

The troops also seized two M16 rifles, two RPGs

(rocket-propelled grenades), and one homemade caliber 50 rifle, according to the Wesmincom spokesman.

Tan said the army was shelling rebel positions with 105-mm howitzers yesterday, while air force planes dropped bombs and helicopters fired rockets near the town of Butig, a base of the country's largest Muslim rebel group, the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF).

But the MILF stayed away from the skirmishes and helped about 8,000 people displaced from their homes when the fighting began on Feb. 20, the military said.

The Philippines signed a peace

deal with the MILF in March 2014, ending 45 years of conflict that killed more than 120,000 people, displaced 2 million and stunted growth in the poor but resource-rich south.

Army and police officials believe some Muslim rebel factions, including the small but violent Abu Sayyaf group, have pledged allegiance to Islamic State militants in Iraq and Syria, but say they have found no evidence to support this.

The fighting broke out late Saturday night last week when Muslim rebels led by the Maute brothers attacked a detachment of the Army 51st Infantry Battalion in Barangay Bayabao, Butig town. (With a report from Reuters)

Tension orips Lanao Surtown hall

ANAO DEL SUR: Tension ran high in Balabagan town here after the vice mayor refused to step down as acting mayor despite an order from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) for the incumbent to resume office.

Mayor Edna Ogka-Benito said supporters of Vice Mayor Quirino Sampiano—many of them armed with steel pipes and sticks—have blocked the municipal building and prevented her and government officials from reporting to work.

The police also failed to serve the DILG order to Sampiano after the protesters who overwhelmed them posted themselves within and around the municipal hall.

Benito was ordered suspended by the Ombudsman on December 28 last year following a complaint lodged by Nasser Disalungan, president of the Association of Barangay Chairmen (ABC) for simple misconduct.

Disalungan claimed Benito withheld his salary but the mayor alleged that the village chairman was not reporting to office.

On Feb. 2 the Court of Appeals 22nd Division issued a temporary restraining order (TRO) allowing Benito back to work pending final resolution of the complaint filed by Disalungan.

DILG Secretary in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM), Anwar Malang, confirmed the TRO and also issued an order for Sampiano to step down and allow Benito to serve her term.

Billy Ogka, Benito's aide, said local DILG director McMillan Lucman was also threatened by Sampiano's supporters and warned him to stay away from the town hall.

The mayor has urged the na-

tional government and authorities to immediately resolve the problem as it has already affected the delivery of basic services to the people of Balabagan.

She also asked her supporters and the police to exercise maxi-

mum tolerance to avoid direct confrontation with Sampiano's group. Residents have volunteered to protect Benito, who was temporarily holding office in her residence.

Municipal officials were also reporting for office at Benito's

house because they were under threat by Sampiano's supporters.

There was no immediate statement from Sampiano on the allegations. He is running against Benito, who is seeking re-election, in the May polls under the Liberal Party.

Reds attack Albay military detachment; 1 wounded

Communist New People's Army (NPA) rebels yesterday harassed a military detachment in Albay, wounding an Army man.

Col. Perfecto Peñaredondo, commander of the 2nd Infantry Battalion, said that more or less five NPA rebels positioned themselves about 300 meters from the Army detachment in Barangay San Ramon, Daraga and fired at the military position.

"Sporadic enemy gunfire lasted about one minute that resulted to one of our soldiers slightly wounded," Peñaredondo said.

Peñaredondo identified the wounded soldier as Sgt. Lorenzo Hernan.

"Combat first aid was immediately applied to Hernan before he was rushed to Bicol Regional Teaching and Training Hospital for further treatment," he said.

Peñaredondo said that said pursuit operations are still ongoing against the communist attackers.

According to Peñaredondo, the detachment is a newly established camp of the 22nd Infantry Battalion (Cafgu). They just moved in to Barangay San Ramon, Daraga, Albay last Feb. 12, 2016.

"The area was previously classified as an NPA influenced barangay, however, AFP Bayanihan Team efforts there last year were successful in clearing it from NPA influence, thus, the establishment of the new camp," Peñaredondo said.

In this light, Southern Luzon Command chief Lt. Gen. Ricardo Visaya ordered all subordinate commanders to ensure that areas cleared from NPA influence should never be recovered by the insurgents.

Thousands flee deadly clash in Mindanao

At least six people have been killed and more than 20,000 displaced during a week of fighting between Islamic militants and security forces in Mindanao, authorities said yesterday.

Three soldiers and three militants were confirmed killed in the clashes, which involved followers of a slain Indonesian leader of a Southeast Asian militant group, the military said.

"There was attack and counter-attack, sniping and counter-sniping, and artillery fire," military spokesman Col. Noel Detoyato said, describing the fighting that began on Saturday with an attack on a military post.

On Thursday night, government security forces overran a terrorist encampment in Lanao del Sur after week-long bombardment and ground assaults that resulted in more than 50 people killed.

Detoyato said that the Army's 103rd Brigade, led by Col. Roseller Murillo, are still conducting clearing operations in Barangay Bayabao, Butig town

"Our troops captured the terrorist lair. They are now clearing the area for possible explosives," Detoyato said.

According to Detoyato, around 30 terrorists were killed during Thursday's clashes in Barangay Bayabao but only three bodies were recovered from the site.

Also recovered on Thursday night were two rocket-propelled grenades, two M16 rifles and a homemade caliber .50 rifle.

More or less 20 terrorists were also reported killed during initial stages of the conflict which started last Saturday when the rebels attacked a military detachment.

Among the terrorist killed were the leader

of the terrorist group Omar Maute and Indonesian Mohammad Muktar.

Maute is a Jordan-trained Filipino jihadist. He is married to an Indonesian he met in Jordan during training.

On the other hand, six government troops were killed while more than a dozen other? were wounded during the week-long skirmishes.

The military deployed OV-10 bomber planes it to conduct periodic bomb runs at the enemy in positions while MG520 attack helicopters provided close air support to advancing ground troops.

Maj. Filemon Tan Jr., spokesman for the military's Western Mindanao Command, said that operations are continuing against the "foreign and local terrorist organization" pinned down in Butig.

"We have continuing operations. We have ground troops advancing, supported by armored assets," Tan said.

Efforts to secure a peace deal with the largest rebel group, the Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF), recently collapsed after congress failed to pass a law that would have created an autonomous Muslim region in Mindanao.

The collapse of the previous peace processin 2008 led hardline MILF commanders to launch attacks on Christian villages in Mindanao, which killed more than 400 people and displaced 600,000.

This week's fighting took place in a region bordering a stronghold of a powerful MILF commander.

But military officials said MILF did not take part in this week's clashes.

They said the group involved in the clashes was led by followers of Indonesian Ustadz Sanusi, a member of the Jemaah Islamiyah who was killed in the southern Philippines in 2012.

Marcelino vows to tell all

Marine Lt. Col. Ferdinand Marcelino has vowed to divulge the real reason for his presence in the apartment where 64 kilos of shabu was seized last month.

During the preliminary investigation hearing at the Department of Justice (DOJ) yesterday. Marcelino asked investigating Senior Deputy Prosecutor Theodore Vilianueva to hold a final clarificatory hearing on the drug charges against him.

He asked that the hearing be held in executive session or behind closed doors, hinting that he would divulge "sensitive information."

The detained former Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency official specifically requested the presence of acting DOJ Secretary Emmanuel Caparas, Prosecutor General Claro By EDU PUNAY

Arellano, National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) director Virgilio Mendez and Intelligence Service Armed Forces of the Philippines (ISAFP) chief Arnold Quiapo during the hearing.

Villanueva verified with a representative from the Philippine Navy Marcelino's claim that he may be charged for divulging confidential information.

The prosecutor then agreed to hold the clarificatory hearing on March 7, wherein Marcelino would be required to submit his rejoinder to the charges before the case is submitted for resolution.

Marcelino and his Chinese companion, Yan Yi Shuo, are facing charges of conspiracy in manufacture and possession of illegal drugs under Republic Act 9165 (Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002).

Marcelino had denied the charges and insisted in his counter-affidavit that he was in the storage facility where shabo with an estimated street value of P257 million was seized for a covert operation as a member of ISAFP.

In an earlier hearing, he submitted a certification from Intelligence and Security Group of the Philippine Army showing Marcelino is sharing intelligence miormation on the alleged involvement of Army personnel in the illegal drug trade from September to December last year.

He has also submitted an official letter from the NBI confirming his contribution to the NBI's anti-drug operations via his intelligence work.
