Separation not divorce?

One official said President Duterte was merely reiterating a previous statement. Another said a "separation" was not a "divorce." Cabinet secretaries said the military treaty with the US is not being abrogated and trade and investment ties would continue. And foreign affairs officials were clueless on what the President meant.

A Babel of voices from his officials followed President Duterte's announcement on Thursday of his military and economic "separation" from the United States and his pivot to a "triumvirate" against the world" with China and Russia.

The announcement, made on separate occasions during the President's state visit to Beijing, has apparently left his officials just as flummoxed as many others, particularly those in the US and possibly even in Beijing and Moscow.

Presidential spokesman Ernesto Abella said Duterte's announcement was merely a reiteration of his wish for an independent foreign policy. For Presidential Communications Office Secretary Martin

Andanar, the "separation" is akin to a son leaving his father's home to raise a family of his own. Both officials were with Duterte in Beijing during the latter's state visit, which ended yesterday.

"It was a restatement of his position on charting an independent foreign policy as provided in the Philippine Constitution that he has repeatedly made in domestic speeches, asserting the imperative to separate the nation from dependence on the US and the West, and rebalance economic and military relations with our Asian neighbors and the ASEAN community," Abella added

Duterte's controversial statement was made at a meeting with the Filipino community and at the Phl-China Trade and Investment Forum. "In this venue I announce my separation from the US; militarily, (but) not socially, (and) economically," the President

"This is not an intent to renege on our treaties and agreements with our established allies but an assertion that we are an independent and sovereign nation, now finding common ground with friendly neighbors with shared aspirations in the spirit of mutual respect, support and cooperation, Abella added The Palace's statement came after US State Department spokesman John Kirby said Duterte's remarks are "inexplicably at odds with the very close relationship" between the two countries.

Asked if she was as confused as everybody else, Banaag said she was not. "Well, not really. I'm sure may direksyon naman 'yan pagbalik

nila (there will be direction when they return). It's just that we are not the right authority to give or interpret what the President has announced, she said,

At the DFA, spokesman Charles Jose said, "There will be discussions" with the US on the matter, but admitted he was not sure if it's the DFA which would send an official communication to the US "I don't know yet. Let's wait and see," he said.

Duterte issued the same statement before the Filipino community on the same day of his bilateral meeting with Chinese President Xi Jinping. "Maybe I will also go to Russia to talk to (President Vladimir) Putin and tell him that there are three of us against the world – China, Philippines and Russia. It's the only way," he said.

Earlier, Duterte ordered a stop to joint exercises with US forces. He had cursed US President Barack Obama, the European Union and the United Nations for criticizing the conduct of his war on illegal drugs.

'Unnecessary uncertainty

US seeks clarification on Duterte's 'separation' statement; it means lessen dependence – Palace

nited States officials are seeking clarification on President Duterte's declaration in China last Thursday that he has decided to "separate" from the US, which they said is creating "tunnecess are uncertainty."

"We are going to be seeking an explanation of exactly what the President meant when he talked about separation from the US It's not alear to us exactly what that means it all its ramifications so we're going to be seeking a > \$

clarification on that, US State Department Spokesman John Kirby said in a press briefing Friday (Manila time)

"We still hold that it is inexplicably at odds with the very close relationship that we have with the Filipino people as well as the government there on many different levels – not just from a security perspective," Kirby added.

Amid what they described as Duterte's "troubling rhetoric" US embassy press attaché Molly Koscina reiterated that the US will continue to honor its alliance commitments and treaty obligations, as they also expect the Philippines to do the same

In Manila, US embassy press attache Molly Koscina said in an email to Manila Bulletin that they have yet to hear from the Philippine government what Duterte's remarks on "separation" might mean, adding, "It is creating unnecessary uncertainty"

Koscina noted that the US-Philippine alliance is built on a 70-year history, rich people-to-people ties, including a vibrant Filipino-American diaspora, and a long list of shared security concerns:

As such, she said: "We have full confidence in the strong ties that connect our peoples and countries, including record lev-

els of trade, investment, and remittances"

"As we have stated, we continue to focus on our broad relationship with the Philippines, and will work together in the many areas of mutual interest to improve the livelihoods of the Philippine people and uphold our shared democratic values," she added

White House Principal Deputy Press Secretary Eric Schultz, in a press gaggle aboard Air Force One En Route to Miami Florida Friday (Thursday night, Manila time) said the US has yet to receive any official request from Malacanang officials to alter any of the two government's many issues where they bilaterally cooperate

Shultz said as far as the US is concerned, it has always believed that it is in the interest of countries in the Asia-Pacific to have strong relationships with a responsible China

"We don't consider this a zero-sum game," he said. "We believe that it's in our national security interest when our parfners and allies in the region have strong relationships with China, consistent with international norms."

Outgoing American Ambassador Philip Goldberg said both countries are going through a "period of uncertainty" that there is now the need to figure out what is really happening in their relationship But he said the US "wants to continue its relationship with the Philippines". This is the reason clarifications should be issued about what President Duterte said while he was in China

While saying that he doesn't know what the President meant by his "separation" statement, Goldberg pointed out that the US' relationship with the Philippines is very strong,

"I don't know what the process is, I don't know what the goal and objective is, all I know is what I hear and not what I see, because what I see is that we're still working very much, we are the Philippine colleagues and in fact have very good relationship," he added in an televised interview Friday

Goldberg said from the point of view of the US, it is "not suing for divorce"

President Duterte's comments came after he met his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping at the Great Hall of the People in Tiananmen Square last Thursday The two pledged to enhance trust and friendship and played down a maritime dispute in the South China Sea

Trade Secretary Ramon Lopez, who is with Duterte in China, said the Philip pines will merely lessen dependence on the US and not totally cut economic and trade relations with the western ally

Lopez affirmed there would be no drastic changes in the Philippine-US trade ties, saying the President simply wants a "balancing" of the "friendship and partnership" with foreign trading partners

"Realistically, hindi mo mahihinto ang pagta-transaction (with the US)," Lopez said, citing the many US investments currently in the Philippines.

Like Lopez, Presidential Communications Operations Secretary Martin Andanar said the government is merely seeking a "rebalancing of economic relations" and lessen dependence on the west, the officials said

"Separation is like, it's not a annulment. It's not a divorce. It's like a father and a son. A son has to leave to the house, and the son has to marry and move to a different house," Andanar said

in a media interview in Beijing

"The United States was a father to us for a long time and it is but timely alreadyffor us to move out of that house and secure our own house and decide for ourselves," he added

Finance Secretary Carlos Dominguez and Socio-Economic Planning Secretary Ernesto Pernia also explained that the Philippines would keep its trade relations with the western nations even as it is forging closer ties with its regional neighbors.

In a joint statement, the two officials said the Cabinet would move "strongly and swiftly" toward regional economic integration

2 suspects killed in Maguindanao encounter

GENERAL SANTOS CITY — Two suspected members of a lawless armed group were killed following a shootout with a composite police and military team which stormed their stronghold in a remote village in General Salipada K. Pendatun, Maguindanao on Thursday

Lt. Col. Ricky Bunayog, 33rd Infantry Battalion commander, said the security forces composed of military intelligence operatives and personnel of PNP- Criminal Investigation and Detection Group, were out to serve the arrest warrant against members of the

Mogantong-Bansil armed group but were repulsed by the suspects

The local armed group was tagged in a series of criminal activities, including murder, kidnapping, robbery, oar theft and arson

A member of the group, identified as Ryan Bansil was arrested during the raid.

At least three Philippine Army troopers were slightly wounded during the nearly hour-long skirmish.

The wounded soldiers were identified as Sgt. Aurelio Ferrer, Cpl. Marcial Duri and PFC Denemar AlbaniThe lawmen seized several high-powered firearms from the group's lair.

Abus attack S. Korean eize captain, crew

ZAMBOANGA CITY -Suspected Abu Sayyaf militants hijacked a South Korean cargo ship and seized the captain and its crew off Bongao, , Tawi-Tawi on Thursday.

Western Mindanao Com-- mand spokesman Maj. Filemon Tan said some 10 gun-, men boarded the MV Dong Bang Giant using ropes from a speedboat and snatched the captain Park Jul Hong and Filipino crewman Glenn - Alindajao.

The cargo ship was on its way to South Korea from Australia when they were in the Sulu Sea.

Initial reports said the captain was able to make a distress call before he was taken by the bandits, suspected to be the faction of Abu Sayyaf sub-leader Idang Susukan based in Sulu.

The Joint Task Force-Tawi-Tawi (JTFT) under Col. Custodio Parcon has been alerted By ROEL PAREÑO

and dispatched all its units to intercept the bandits and resintercepted by the gunmen cue the captives once spotted in Tawi-Tawi.

Tan said troops in the nearby province of Sulu have also conducted intercept operations as the area has been used by the Abu Sayvaf in hiding hostages taken near the border with Sahah

"As of press time, validation and intelligence moni-

toring are currently being conducted by the military in coordination with local chief executives and the locals to track down the perpetrators and safely rescue the victims," Tan said.

Initial reports said the gunmen spared the other crewmembers, one of whom managed to call his family to alert the authorities.

KOREAN SHIP Captain, Grew Man Seized

The Armed Forces of the Philippines' Western Mindanao Command (Wesmincom) is ascertaining the *whereabouts of a South Korean cargo ship captain and Filipino crew member abducted by suspected Abu Sayyaf terrorists off Bongao, Tawi-Tawi, on Thursday

The military has yet to release a full report on the incident. The Wesmincom based in Zamboanga City said it had dispatched its Joint Task Force Tawi-Tawi to track down the hostage-takers.

Monitoring

"Validation and intelligence monitoring are currently being conducted by the military in coordination with local chief executives and the locals to track down the perpetrators and safely resque the victims," Wesmincom spokesperson Maj Filemon Tan said in a statement.

Tan said 10 armed menon a speedboat believed to be Abu Sayyaf members boarded the M/V Dong Bang Giant and took Capt. Park Chul Hong and crew member Glenn Alindajao, a Cebuano.

Tan said the other crewmen were not taken and one managed to call his family, who reported the abduction to authorities.

The ship was on its way to South Korea from Australia.—with reports from Karlomanlupig ap INQ is

AFP to Abu Sayyaf bandit

AMBOANGA CITY - The Sub-Regional Human Rights Commission (RHRC) in Basilan-Sulu-Tawi-Tawi or BaSulTa and the International Monitoring Team (IMT) for the peace process met with members of the Joint Task Force Sulu (JTFS) in Jolo, Sulu aimed at finding the sentiments of soldiers pursuing Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) bandits in the province.

Soldiers who met the RHRC and IMT urged the ASG bandits in Sulu last Wednesday and Thursday, to surrender, preserve their precious lives and to live

a normal life anew.

The ARMM BaSulTa Sub-RHRC led by Lawyer Edy Lyn Santiago conferred with JTFS officers on the status of hu-

man rights awareness of troops and was assured of the compliance of soldiers on Human Rights, International Humanitarian Law and the Rule of Law.

The IMT on the other hand was led by Malaysian Maj. Gen. Datuk Wir Zamrose who conferred with JTFS and LGU officials on the status of peace process in the province.

JTFS officials cited the case of suspected ASG member Pauji Asgari who

was arrested last Tuesday.

Asgari was treated well, brought to the hospital for medical check-up and was immediately provided food, the JTFS said.

Soldiers in Sulu are calling on the ASG bandits to surrender following successive encounters which resulted in the death of numerous bandits.

Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) Chief of Staff Gen. Ricardo Visaya earlier called on the ASG to surrender to preserve lives and for them to have a new life, a week after, 21 bandits from Basilan surrendered to government forces.

Reports from communities indicate that many ASG bandits are keen on surrendering to the government but are being discouraged by their leaders by warning them they will be shot and killed by the military once they yield, which the AFP has denied.

Since July this year, a total of 36 ASG bandits were killed in Sulu while scores were wounded while the AFP had 15 casualties and 28 wounded in action. It likewise rescued 16 kidnap victims.

Twelve more kidnap victims are still being held by the ASG in Sulu.

Rody eyes nev Mamasapan

RESIDENT Rodrigo Duterte may order a new investigation into the massacre of 44 police commandos in Mamasapano, Maguindanao in January 2015 to find out what really happened.

Duterte raised the possibility of a new probe in his speech during the Philippines-China Trade and Investment Forum in Beijing Thursday. He stressed that his intention is not to "prosecute" people but to find out what happened to the ransom offered for terrorist Zulkifli Abdhir, also known as Marwan, who was the subject of the special operation mounted by members of the Special Action Force of the police.

"Forty-four Mamasapano soldiers, they went inside, they died. No dramatics, no nothing. Except that we grieve for our soldiers. Maybe, in the days ahead, I will order the opening of that issue again," Duterte said.

" Not really to prosecute people but just to know what happened. Who got the five million? Whether the tip of the finger of Marwan, was gotten by the Special Forces of United States or was it really brought to the forensic division there in (Camp) Crame," he added, referring to the national headquarters

The President said he wants Filipinos to know the truth about the incident.

"These are the lies that are imposed upon the people which is not good. Let us go for the truth. Let it out," Duterte said.

Almost 400 police commandos swooped

down on the village of Mamasapano on January 25, 2015 to capture Marwan and another terrorist, Basit Usman.

But after killing Marwan, the SAF commandos were ambushed by heavily armed Muslim rebels and mowed down.

Eighteen rebels and five civilians were also killed.

Former President Benigno Aquino drew flak for allowing then Philippine National Police chief Alan Purisima to plan and execute Oplan Exodus despite his suspension on graft charges.

Purisima and former SAF commander Chief Supt Getulio Napeñas were charged with graft, grave misconduct, gross neglect of duty and conduct prejudicial to the best interest of the service by the Office of the Ombudsman

Separate investigations by the Senate and the PNP's Board of Inquiry (BOI) also found Aquino responsible for the incident.

The National Bureau of Investigation and National Prosecution Service recommended the filing of murder and theft charges against 90 members of the Moro Islamic Liberation Front and other private armed groups for killing the Local: 5285, 5295 police commandos.

In July this year, relatives of the slain policemen filed charges against Aquino, Purisima and Napeñas at the Office of the Ombudsman.
