

Army's Solcom Gets new chief

BY DEMPSEY REYES

HE commander of the Philippine Army's 4th Infantry Division will be sitting as the new chief of the military's Southern Luzon Command (Solcom).

Maj. Gen. Benjamin Madrigal served as the commander of the 4th Infantry Division but prior to that he was the chief of staff of the Philippine Army and was designated as acting division commander of the 10th Infantry Division.

Madrigal has a master's degree in Management Studies from the University of South Wales in Canberra, Australia, in 1999 and a master's degree in Public Administration from the Philippine Christian University in 2006.

He will be replacing Lt. Gen-Ferdinand Quidilla, a member of the Philippine Military Academy (PMA) "Matikas" Class of 1983.

Madrigal is a member of the PMA "Sandiwa" Class of 1985.

A source told reporters that President Rodrigo Duterte signed the appointment papers of Madrigal early last week, designating him as the new chief of the "security-sensitive" part of the country, the Solcom.

Solcom is a unified command unit under the Armed Forces of the Philippines that has battled communist rebels from the New

Ppeople's Army since the 1970s in Southern Luzon, a hotbed of Maoist insurgency.

For Madrigal, a native of Los Banos, Laguna, "unified" efforts among Solcom men would be of assistance for the whole command to develop and has expressed confidence that he can "suppress" the NPA rebels.

"It's easier to do here than in Mindanao. In Mindanao, lots of enemies are there, in Southern Luzon, it's basically what is remaining here [Solcom] are remnants," he said.

"Of course, the atmosphere of development is also important.

The government is working and [enemy] propaganda will not take effect. Everybody will have their own goal and everybody is contributing," Madrigal added.

The Army general sought assistance from stakeholders and residents in addressing possible security threats in Southern Luzon.

"I am envisioning participation coming from stakeholders here in our campaign against lawless elements surrounding the area," according to Madrigal.

But despite his campaign in neutralizing NPA rebels in Solcom, Madrigal said there is nothing to fear with his leadership.

A military source told reporters that Maj. Gen. Ronald Villanueva of the Intelligence Service of the Atmed Forces of the Philippines (ISAFP) will be assuming the previous position of Madrigal as commander of the 4th Infantry Division.

Brig. Gen. Macairog Alberto of the 1001st Infantry Brigade will sit as the new chief of the ISAFP.

Aside from Quidilla, Lt. Gen. Roméo Tanalgo of the Northern Luzon Command will be retiring in September but his replacement is yet to be announced.

New Solcom chief sets sights on NPA

PRESIDENT Duterte has designated Maj. Gen. Benjamin Madrigal, chief of the Army's 4th Infantry Division, as the new commander of a unified command leading the fight against communist rebels in southern Luzon.

Madrigal is due to assume command as the new chief of the Southern Luzon Command (Solcom) based in Lucena City today, vice Lt. Gen. Ferdinand Quidilla who is due to reach the retirement age of 56 on August 30.

Duterte approved the designation of Madrigal as Solcom commander last week, on the recommendation of the AFP's Board of Generals which is chaired by AFP chief Gen. Eduardo Año.

Madrigal, a member of the Philippine Military Academy class of 1985, assumed as chief of the Cagayan de Oro City-based 4th ID in March last year. Before that, he was the Army's chief of staff.


He has held other significant positions in the Armed Forces, including chief of the War Plans Division at the office of the AFP deputy chief of staff for operations, chief of the Army's Management and Fiscal Office, commander of the 701st Brigade, and deputy commander of the 10th Infantry Division. – Victor Reves

Stop Marawi bombings, ulamas urge Duterte

HE Ulama League of the Philippines on Thursday called on President Rodrigo Duterte to stop bombings in Marawi City and find other ways to purge the remaining terrorists there.

In a statement received by the military's Western Mindanao Command (WestMinCom), the group expressed its support to the government's campaign against the Islamic State-linked Maute Group but appealed that the air strikes be stopped.

"[W]hile we support this action and other programs of the government for peace and development, we are earnestly requesting the President of the Philippines to find other ways to purge out of Marawi the extremists rather than aerial bombings

which have caused and is continuously causing damage to lives and property," it said.

The Commission on Human Rights had earlier appealed to the Armed Forces of the Philippines to halt the air strikes to avoid civilian casualties.

Multi-sectoral groups based in Mindanao also urged the government to stop dropping bombs on the besieged city.

· The Ulama League of the Philippines condemned the Maute group for portraying a negative image of Islam, causing destruction in Marawi, killing civilians and taking hostages.

The military said it respects the appeal of the ulamas but that it will continue with its air strikes.

Capt. Jo-ann Petinglay, West-MinCom spokeswoman, said command chief Lt. Gen. Carlito Galvez Ir. noted the importance of air strikes.

She said mosques and religious iconic structures will not be bombed:

The Ulama council also committed its assistance for the reconstruction and rehabilitation 55 Local: 5285, 5295 of Marawi City, suggesting that the council be tapped to monitor the reconstruction and rehabilitation of the city.

Duterte finalizes plans for Marawi rehab

PRESIDENT Duterte on Wednesday night ordered various agencies to expedite the rehabilitation and reconstruction of Marawi.

The President issued the instructions during a meeting in Malacañang with Trade Secretary Ramon Lopez and representatives of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Council (HUDCC), Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB), National Housing Authority (NHA), Pagtutulungan sa Kinabukasan: Ikaw, Bangko, Industria at Gobyerno (PAG-IBIG), and the Local Water Utilities Administration (LWUA).

Duterte issued the order even as Muslim leaders asked him to stop military airstrikes against the Maute Group involved in the continuing rebellion in Marawi City since May 23.

The Ulama League of the Philippines made the request in a statement issued on Wednesday at the culmination of a three-day "Search for a United Voice for Peace and Justice" conference held in Iligan City.

The group furnished copies of the statement to Defense Secretary Delfin Lorenzana and AFP chief Gen. Eduardo Año

The statement condemned the "violent extremist group," referring to the Maute Group, noting their acts "have portrayed a negative image of Islam" and "have caused the destruction in Marawi City."

Duterte, according to a statement released by Malacañang, said the government should be prepared to immediately execute the recovery plans for the Islamic City and other affected areas once the Armed Forces and the PNP are done with clearing operations.

Duterte also said rehabilitation efforts would purely be a "civilian endeavor." He also stressed the need to continuously provide displaced families with their most basic needs such as food and clean water.

He also assured the different agencies that he will push for the realignment of the country's budget to cater to the needs of each department in relation to the funding of their rehabilitation plans.

DSWD Undersecretary Hope Hervilla reported that the distribution of goods in all evacuation centers is still ongoing, while NHA

General Manager Marcelino Escalada Jr. said the construction of temporary shelters will begin in September with priority being given to around 4,900 families living in evacuation centers.

Lopez said the DTI has already provided livelihood equipment like sewing machines and clothing materials to some evacuees and the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) had also committed to donate 100 more sewing machines for the IDPs.

He also identified several other initiatives to help the IDPs return to normal life, including setting up temporary marketplaces in parts of Iligan where evacuees can set up their own stores. He said the DTI will also work with the Department of Labor and Employment on the conduct job fairs for IDPs.

Before the meeting, Duterte met with actor Robin Padilla and witnessed the signing of a Deed of Donation (DOD) between the latter and the DSWD through Social Welfare Undersecretary Emmanuel Leyco. Padilla donated P5 million "for the immediate psychosocial intervention for the children affected by the hostilities in Marawi City."

NO TO BOMBING

The Ulama League of the Philippines expressed its support to Duterte's instruction to the Armed Forces to purge out-the-violent extremists out of Marawi City.

"(But) while we support this action and other programs of the government for peace and development, we are earnestly requesting the President ... to find other ways to purge out of Marawi the extremists rather than the aerial bombings," the group said.

It noted that such airstrikes "have caused and is continuously causing damage to lives and property."

The military has been utilizing various Air Force aircraft in hitting enemy positions in Marawi City, including the SF-260 fighter jets and SF-260 planes which figured in friendly fire incidents that caused the death of 12 soldiers

involved in the ongoing operations in the city.

The group also asked the government to involve Muslim leaders in the reconstruction and rehabilitation of Marawi City, especially those that concern the moral, spiritual, social, educational and religious aspects of the endeavor.

Sought for a comment, AFP Western Mindanao Command and Joint Task Force Marawi spokesperson Capt. Jo-ann Petinglay said Wesmincom commander Lt. Gen. Carlito Galvez said airstrikes are stillneeded in the ongoing operations.

ing operations.

"The response by commander Wesmincom is that airstrikes are still needed. These are needed by our troops on the ground. But he said we will see... His answer is 'we will see" but he didn't say their request is a no," said Petinglay.

Petinglay assured that the airstrikes being done are commensurate to the resistance offered by the enemy. – With Victor Repes

Robin donates P5M for displaced Marawi kids

PRESIDENT Rodrigo Roa Duterte witnessed the turnover of the P5 million deed of donation by actor Robin Padilla to the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) for the

victims of Marawi City.

DSWD Undersecretary Emmanuel Leyco received the donation from Padilla in simple ceremonies in Malacañang Palace Wednesday evening.

The P5-million donation is intended for the immediate psychosocial intervention for the children affected by the hostilities in Marawi

the hostilities in Marawi City, it was said.

The President personally thanked Padilla during the turnover ceremony.

Present at the turnover rites were Fisheries Development Authority General Manager Glen Pangapalan, Frabelle Foods Corporation president Francisco Tiu Lau-

rel Jr., and the actor's brother Rommel Padilla.
The AFP earlier said various groups have conducted psychosocial aid in Marawi City to address the stress experienced by the displaced residents, parti-cularly the children.

Reports said over 7,200

Marawi crisis evacuees face mental health issues.

The Lanao del Sur Provincial Health Office said on August 6 that 7,248 evacuees from the Marawi crisis need mental health intervention

and psychosocial support. Seventy-eight of them had severe mental health issues and were hospitalized.

Meanwhile, 6,574 evacuees need focused interven-tions like one-on-one therapy sessions. In addition, 529 need community and

family support.

Marawi Crisis Management Committee Spokesperson Zia Alonto Adiong said son Dia Aiomo Adlong sale they need more experts to deal with this emerging cri-sis, as well as more food supplies to ensure proper nutrition and better state of mind of evacuees.

Meanwhile, the President also had a meeting with members of Reform the Armed Forces Movement

(RAM), including its leader Sen Gregorio Honasan II.

The meeting came after Honasan was indicted for graft and posted bail over the alleged misuse of his P29.1million Priority Development

Assistance Fund in 2012.

The President ended a rather hectic Wednesday night by playing like a good neighbor as he visited and handed P5,000 cash aid to the fire victims in San Miguel, Manila.

Duterte met hundreds of the homeless victims inside the San Miguel Church. He gave P5,000 and relief goods to each family.

AFP soldiers train in US military base

For the first time, members of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) were given access to a United States (US) military base to train with US Marines from Combat Assault Battalion, 3rd Marine Division.

According to the US Embassy in Manila, Philippine Marines from Assault Armor Battalion worked alongside their American counterparts in Okinawa for more than two weeks to become familiar with Amphibious Assault Vehicles and how to best utilize their capabilities.

The US embassy reported that during the training, Filipino Marines learned different amphibious skills such as hand signaling, egress training, and water operations. They also familiarized themselves with maintenance procedures, logistical planning, and facility capabilities.

"This training benefits both forces moving forward as they continue to work together during exercises such as Kamandag this October to bolster Philippine amphibious capability and combined security operations," the embassy said in a press statement.
