

FATIMA, PORTUGAL—Pope Francis declared two Portuguese children saints, 100 years after they reported visions of the Virgin Mary. Hundreds of thousands of people broke into applause as the leader of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics announced the Church's newest saints.

FATIMA, PORTUGAL—Pope Francis added two Portuguese shepherd children to the roster of Catholic saints on Saturday, honoring the young siblings whose reported visions of the Virgin Mary 100 years ago turned the Portuguese farm town of Fatima into one of the world's most important Catholic shrines.

Francis proclaimed Francisco and Jacinta Marto saints at the start of Mass marking the centenary of their visions. Hundreds of thousands of people, many of whom slept outdoors to hold their places, broke into applause as the leader of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics proclaimed the siblings the newest of the Church's saints.

Francisco and Jacinta, aged 9 and 7, and their 10-year-old cousin, Lucia Dos Santos, reported that on May 13, 1917, the Virgin Mary made the first of a halfdozen appearances to them here while they grazed their sheep.

They said she confided in them three secrets, the socalled secrets of Fatima.

The first two were revealed soon and concerned a vision of hell, seen by believers as a prediction of the outbreak of World War II, a warning that Russia would "spread her errors" in the world and a need for general conversion to God and prayer.

The "third secret" intrigued the world for more than threequarters of a century, inspiring books and cults convinced that it predicted the end of the world.

In 2000, the Vatican said it was a prediction of the 1981 assassination attempt on Pope John Paul II on May 13, the same day of the first reported apparition in 1917.

At the time of the apparition, Europe was in the throes of World War I, and the Portuguese church was suffering under anticlerical laws from the republican government that had driven many bishops and priests into exile.

"Our Lady foretold, and warned us about, a way of life that is godless and indeed profanes God in his creatures," Francis said in his homily. "Such a life, frequently proposed and imposed, risks leading to hell."

He urged Catholics today to use the example of the Marto siblings and draw strength from strikes. The children had been

threatened by local civil authorities with death by boiling oil if they didn't recant their story. But they held fast and eventually the Church recognized the apparitions as authentic in 1930.

"We can take as our examples Saint Francisco and Saint Jacinta, whom the Virgin Mary introduced into the immense ocean of God's light and taught to adore him," he said. "That was the source of their strength in overcoming opposition and suffering."

Prancis prayed that the Madonna would protect the most vulnerable members of society, "especially the sick and the disabled, prisoners and the unemployed, the poor and the abandoned."

Two huge tapestries made from century-old photographs of the children dressed in the traditional peasant garb of the times hung from the church that is now the focal point of the sanctuary visited by about seven million people each year:

The 'Martos now become the youngest-ever saints who didn't die as martyrs.

The third visionary, Lucia, became a nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97. Lucia, who wrote of the children's experiences, is on track for beatification, the first step toward becoming a saint. Her case couldn't begin until after her death.

At the end of the Mass, Francis was to offer a special greeting to the many faithful who flock to Fatima in hopes of healing. Many tossed wax body parts—hands, hearts, livers and limbs—into a giant fire pit at the shrine as an offering.

In Fatima for the occasion were Joao Baptista and his wife, Lucila Yurie, of Brazil. The medically inexplicable healing of their son, Lucas, was one "miracle" needed for the Marto siblings to be declared saints.

The boy, aged 3 refrire time, had fallen 6.5 meters (21 feet) from a window in 2013 and suffered such severe head trauma that his doctors said he would be severely mentally disabled or in a vegetative state if he even survived. The boy not only survived but has no signs of any aftereffects.

Another miracle was wheelchair-bound Maria Emilia Santos who said she regained the ability to walk on February 20, 1989, the anniversary of Jacinta's death, after praying to her.

Marie Chantal, 57, a lifelong devotee, travelled more than 9,000 kilometers from the island of Reunion in the Indian Ocean to attend the ceremony.

"I am very emotional because this Pope is truly merciful and close to the people and I think he will bring us many good things," she said.

Gracinda Vieira, 57, slept outside during the chill night in Fatima to hold her place near the front of the crowd.

"It was not a great sacrifice ... it is very important for me and for the Church," said Vieira, who had travelled from her home 250 km north of Fatima in central Portugal.

"This Pope is different in everything, I like him a lot. He is closer to us, the people," she said.



# 2 NPAs killed in series of encounters with AFP

AVAO CITY — Two members of the New People's Army (NPA) were killed in a series of skirmishes in the Davao Region with the military from May 6 to 11, the 10th Infantry Division said.

Troops recovered a caliber-38 revolver, an M14 Rifle and various war materiel after the encounters.

More rebels were either killed or wounded, but were carried off by fleeing rebels, as reported by residents in the area of the gun battlers.

A soldier was killed, while nine others were wounded and evacuated to hospitals in Davao City in the May 10 armed clash between troops of the Third Infantry Battalion (3IB) and NPA rebels belonging to Pulang Bagani Company (PBC) 1 in Barangay Dalagdag, Calinan Davao City.

Troops from the 3IB were involved in nine encounters from May 6 to 10, with six firefights with the guerillas reported in Barangay Dominga, Calinan District in this city from May 6 to 9.

Soldiers from the 73rd Infantry Battalion (73IB) were involved in three firefights on May 7, 9 and

Another group of soldiers engaged the same NPA group twice in Barangay Sumimao, Calinan District on May 9, with retreating rebels leaving behind the body of a comrade who was carrying a caliber-38 pistol.

The dead NPA was identified as Jojo Dagahoya, a member of PBC1 from Sitio Balinanao, Brgy Fatima, Paquibato District, Davao City

Another group of soldiers engaged the fleeing NPA band at around 1 a.m. on May 10 at Barangay Dalagdag which resulted in a soldier being killed and nine others

being wounded.

The body of another slain NPA rebel and several war materiel were also found when the smoke cleared on that encounter.

The dead body was identified as Eliazar Templado alias Chin, a political instructor of PBC1 from Calinan Proper, Davao City.

Meanwhile, troops from 73rd Infantry Battalion engaged in a firefight 20 NPA rebels belonging to Guerilla Front 71 at 7:30 a.m. last<sup>1</sup> May 7 at Sitio Kidalagan, Brgy Dan-<sup>1</sup> wata, Malita, Davao Occidental.

The same troops caught up with the fleeing rebels and another firefight two days later in the same barangay.

Another group of 73IB troops' engaged 20 NPA rebels in a firefight at 7:30 a.m. last May 11 at Sitio Lawisa, Brgy Sibulan, Santa-Cruz, Davao del Sur which resulted to the recovery of one M14 rifle left by the rebels.

## **NPA** medic surrenders

CAMP MELCHOR F DELA CRUZ, Upi, Gamu, Tsabela — A medical officer of the New People's Army (NPA) operating in Cordillera provinces voluntarily surrendered to the members of the army's 24th Infantry Battalion based in Barangay Tagodtod, Lagangilang, Abra.

Major General Paul Talay Atal, commander of the Army's 5th Infantry Division and currently head the Joint Task Force "Tala" identified the rebel as Catherine Cortez who is said to be a medical officer of the Kilusang Larangang Guerilla Montes under Leonardo Pacsi Command.

Cortez also yielded several firearms namely one M16A1 Rifle, one rifle grenade, two magazines for M16 rifle; and sixty rounds of 3 5.56mm ammunition.

"We are all Filipinos, and killing

each other will not solve our problems. I encourage the remaining NPA rebels to take advantage of the government's Comprehensive Local Integration Program or CLIP, it will provide you an opportunity to return back to your families and communities, and together we shall solve our problems the peaceful way," said Atal.

Meanwhile, the government troops and police operatives are on heightened alert after a group of NPA rebels harassed a camp of the army's 86th Infantry Battalion based in Barangay Villa Gracia, Maddela, Quirino and a patrol base of the local police of Rizal, Cagayan on Wednesday evening.

## NDFP DEMANDS RELEASE OF ARRESTED REBEL LEADER

DAVAO GITY—The ranking communist leader arrested in Ozamiz City on Thursday was covered by the Joint Agreement on Safety and Immunity Guarantees (Jasig) and should be immediately released from police custody, along with his companions, National Democratic Front of the Philippines (NDFP) chief negotiator Fidel Agcaoili said on Saturday.

"He and his companions, including [Aglipayan Bishop Carlo] and Mrs. [Teofilina] Morales, should be released immediately in accordance with the Jasig," Agcaoili said.

#### Alleged recovery

Rommel Salinas was arrested with the Moraleses and the bishop's driver, Isadome Dalid, at a checkpoint manned by a police and Army team on Thursday in Barangay Gango.

They were taken on account of the alleged recovery of a grenade from Salinas' bag, along with cash.

Agcaoili said Salinas, de-

scribed by the military as the secretary of the Communist Party of the Philippines' Section Committee Sendong in Misamis Occidental, was a "duly accredited person" under the Jasig and was issued ID No. ND978453 under the name of Hermie Abella.

#### Peace process

Agcaoili said Salinas was performing his duties for the peace process at the time of his arrest.

During his arrest, Salinas said his bag's cash content of P80,700 was provided by the NDFP for consultation activities.

"It is obvious that Mr. Salinas has been conducting consultations with stakeholders when he was arrested," Agcaoili said.

He said as far as he can recall, the Jasig—which was "definitely doe signed in 1995—was still in effect and both parties were required to observe it, unless otherwise terminated by either of JERUSALEM INQ

the parties through a written notice.

In February, President Duterte had said he was terminating the Jasig but later restored it as government and NDFP negotiators prepared to talk in the Netherlands.

Under the agreement, listed consultants from both sides and their companions were protected from threats, surveillance and arrest.

#### Religious personality

Iglesia Filipina Independiente also called for the release of Morales and his wife, who was a teacher, and the prelate's driver.

Rev. Dave Bitos said Morales should be released so that "he could return to his work of tending to his flock."

Bitos also explained that as a religious personality, Morales "definitely does not have the intention of bringing [a grenade] inside his official car."

#### Eduardo Año

Close on the heels of Roy Cimatu's appointment, President Duterte tapped the Armed Forces chief of staff to head the Department of the Interior and Local Government. Año can't assume the post until after he retires from the military on Oct. 26. And already, rumors are rife that he will be asked to retire earlier to give way to another official to assume the top Armed Forces of the Philippines post. His impending appointment has given rise to criticisms that the Cabinet is being "militarized." At least four other former generals hold key government posts. In fact, Mr. Duterte's joke that the "junta" would be complete with the entry of Año did not sit well with Jose Maria Sison, founder of the Communist Party of the Philippines. "It can be a joke or a threat at the expense of the peace negotiations, the people and Mr. Duterte himself," he said.

# Is Abu leader dead in airstrike?

The military is uncertain about the fate of Abu Sayyaf leader Furuji Indama.

Col. Edgard Arevalo, Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) Public Affairs Office chief, said they are uncertain if Indama was among the 20 Abu Sayyaf bandits killed in the airstrike in Sumisip town last Thursday.

Col. Juvymax Uy, commander of Joint Task Force Basilan, reported the other day that 20 Abu Sayyaf bandits of the group led by Indama were killed in the airstrike that was followed by artillery barrage at their camp in Barangay Pamatsaken.

Troops, however, failed to recover any casualty from the scene.

What were left of the camp were personal belongings inside bullet-riddled tents and food, indicating the bandits were caught unprepared by the airstrike while having

Military informants, however, did not mention Indama. They said the bandits who survived the attack were able to drag away the bodies of their dead comrades.

Arevalo said he is still waiting for an update.

Lt. Gen. Carlito Galvez Jr., commander of Western Mindanao Command (Westmincom), said intelligence reports indicate the Abu Sayyaf has split up into several groups in an effort to divide the attention of the troops pursuing them.

Galvez said the Abu Sayyaf also split their captives into several groups.

The captives who are believed to still be in the hands of the Abu Sayyaf in Sulu include a Dutch, seven Indonesians, 12 Vietnamese and seven Fili-

Galvez said information from the Abu Sayyaf militants terrorism in Southern Philipwho have surrendered pro-pines," Galvez said. vided the lead on the possible locations of the hostages and Galvez enjoined Muslim reli- holders to condemn all acts of their captors.

Galvez said about 47 Abu Sayyaf from Sulu and Basilan have so far surrendered.

"The troops under the Joint Task Force Sulu led by Brig. Gen. Cirilito Sobejana continued its focus of military operations to pressure the Abu Sayyaf group to yield and release all their hostages," Galvez said.

#### Ulama summit

Meanwhile, the military spearheaded the launching of the Ulama summit last Friday to counter the monitored recruitment of fighters for the Islamic State (IS). 44.75

AFP spokesman Brig. Gen. Restituto Padilla said around 300 Muslim religious leaders attended the summit that was also organized by national government agencies, foreign and local stakeholders.

Galvez was the keynote speaker of the three-day event.

He discussed with key Muslim religious leaders the current terrorism and security concerns in Mindanao.

# Phl, Japanese coast guards hold anti-sea piracy drills

The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) and the Japanese Coast Guard (JCG) held yesterday anti-sea piracy exercises in Mindanao to prevent threats posed by terrorists like the Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG).

The PCG and the JCG held joint antisea piracy exercises in Jolo, Sulu and the Celebes Sea while maritime law enforcement training exercises would be held from May 30 until June 3 in the Davao Gulf.

When asked if there was a chance the ASG would attack the PCG and JCG assets and personnel taking part in the one-day exercise, PCG officer-in-charge Commodore Joel Garcia said, "I don't think so."

He explained that since they would use an air asset of the JCG, there is little possibility that the Muslim bandits would be able to disrupt the event.

The PCG deployed the BRP Romblon, BRP Malapascua and monitoring control and surveillance vessel 3007 while the JCG used a Falcon 900 plane.

They demonstrated communication and surveillance exercises in the event pirates would attack a cargo vessel. "Definitely, we are not worried about the disruption or the Abu Sayyaf taking measures against the exercise because the exercise would be conducted by air to test the maritime surveillance capability of both coast guards," said Garcia.

The maritime exercises would focus on aerial surveillance and reconnaissance.

One of the current challenges that the RCG is facing is sea piracy.

Since the middle of last year, the PCG recorded 22 incidents, of which 13 were actual kidnappings and nine attempted kidnappings in Mindanao.

The problems prevailing in the area prompted them to conduct the exercise in Sulu and Celebes Sea.

"The concern of the international shipping community is how to fight kidnapping and armed robbery at sea and I think the joint exercise between the PCG and JCG would be a good symbolism of our strong partnership and cooperation with respect to combating armed robbery," said Garcia.

JCG vice commandant for operations Vice Admiral Shuichi Iwanami explained that the exercise are in line with the two coast guard agencies' existing memorandum of cooperation.

# Ulamas forge united stand vs terrorism

ZAMBOANGA CITY — The three-day "Ulama Summit against Terrorism" formally closed yesterday at the Shariff Kabunsuan Cultural Complex in Cotabato City with the "bright hope to have one stand and one voice" in the fight against terrorism and extremism in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM).

The summit opened Friday with about 300 Muslim religious leaders, national government officials, and foreign and local stakeholders from the various Muslim dominated provinces and cities in the country.

The summit was organized by the Office of the Regional Governor and the Regional Darul Ifta of the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM).

Around 300 Ulama and Ustadzes from the different provinces in ARMM attended the event which was conceptualized after Daesh groups were monitored recruiting the youth in the different areas of Mindanao.

# Troop seizes ASG camp in Basilan

PHILIPPINE Army troops seized an Abu Sayyaf Group (ASG) encampment on a remote hilltop in Sumisip, Basilan where security forces continue to pursue the notorious militant group tied to the Islamic State (IS).

ASG Sub Leader Furuji Indama was reportedly hiding in the camp but was able to escape before the camp was seized by government forces which has 12 makeshift tents capable of accommodating 30-40 bandits.

Soldiers recovered homemade bomb components left behind by the bandits after the firefight as military aircrafts provided close air support while ground troops pounded the area with artillery fire.

"Our troops were able to cordon the enemy due to the accurate and timely indirect fires and close air support delivered by our Artillery and the Philippine Air Force," Col. Juvymax Uy, Joint Task Force Basllan commander, said.

Meanwhile, Captain Jo-ann
Petinglay, spokesman for the Western
Mindanao Command, quoting reports
from Army commanders in Basilan,
said about 20 bandits were killed in the
clashes since May 11.

She added troops also recovered several foodstuffs and explosives components capable of making 30 improvised explosive device, where the Special Forces Demolition Specialists recovered three live IEDs.

# Scaled-down 'Balikatan' still relevant – US general

HIS year's joint military exercises between Philippine and US troops remains "relevant and beneficial" even if scaled down to training on counter-terrorism and humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR), the American training director for the "Balikatan" (shoulder to shoulder) exercises said.

"Despite the fact that this is not a large-scale conventional force, a portion of 'Balikatan' this year, the counter-terrorism (training) is legitimate. It's real, its something we're doing together and I think that continued training on that is beneficial for both of our nations," Lt. Gen. Lawrence Nicholson said shortly after the opening ceremonies of the annual military drills this week.

"HADR is always relevant and I think especially as typhoon season [draws near] across the region, our ability to respond and help neighbors has never been more important," he said.

"Balikatan" 2017, which began on May 8 and will end on May 19, features mostly high-impact HADR training, including rescuing people trapped in a collapsed structure during a massive earthquake and landing relief units and goods in a typhoon-isolated area.

HADR is one of the missions

When asked whether US troops, 2,600 of whom are participating in "Balikatan," felt let down because of the exercises' focus on HADR and counter-terrorism. Nicholson said this was not the case.

"I can tell you that every Marine, sailor, soldier, man coming to the Philippines for the exercise, is not disappointed. They are looking forward to it. Again, as I said, HADR and counter-terrorism are two critically important areas of concern for both of our nations, for all other

work to be done," he said.

A total of 2,800 Filipinos and 80 military personnel from the Australian Defense Force are also participating in the 12-day exercise.

"There's a lot of sharing of techniques and tactics and procedures so we're excited by the work that we are going to do, and yes absolutely, we think [that] in the years ahead, there will be different focuses for 'Balikatan,' so I'm confident of this year's success," Nicholson said.

The exercises were only downscaled after Duterte sought to end the "Balikatan" exercises with the US last year, so as not to agitate China. Duterte also claimed there was no nations, so I think there's a lot of 1-transfer of technical know-how during large-scale drills with the Americans.

Manila however has treaty obligations with Washington.

Apart from the 1951 Mutual Defense Treaty in which both countries agreed to defend each other in case of an external attack, Manila and Washington signed in 1998 a Visiting Forces Agreement (VFA) governing the conduct of American soldiers in the Philippines.

The 10-year Enhanced Defense Cooperation Agreement signed by the previous Aquino administration in 2014, a supplement to the VFA, allows the rotational presence of US troops as well as their access to Philippine military facilities.

# ISIS NOW IN CENTRAL MINDANAO —DU30

PRESIDENT Rodrigo Duterte on Saturday warned that the jihadist Islamic State forces have already migrated to the Central Mindanao from their lairs in Sulu province.

Speaking to the Filipino community in Hong Kong, Duterte said that the country would have been in "heaven" already only if terrorism and drugs won't exist.

"Iyang ISIS kasi, sana huwag mangyari. From Jolo, they have migrated to Central Mindanao," Duterte said in Filipino.

Duterte insisted that the only thing he won't do is to talk with terrorists, and that the full might of the military will be used to destroy them.

"I can't talk to terrorists. One of them was adopted as the chair of the ISIS in Mindanao," Duterte said, without explaining further.

"Now we have jets ... I am using it, before we didn't use it, but now, I have to use them hastily to [destroy] the enemy. Because they're very dangerous," he added.

Meanwhile, Defense Secretary Defin Lorenzana told Congress that military offensives have weakened the terror groups.

In a recent House committee on national defense and national security situation, Lorenzana, along with Armed Forces of the Philippines' General Eduardo Año, told the House of Representatives the government will continue its assault so as not to give the terror groups a chance to regroup.

Both officials expressed optimism the peace talks between the government and the Moro Islamic Liberation Front would result in fewer skirmishes with government troops.

Among the internal security concerns being addressed were the threats coming from the extremist groups, such as the Abu Sayyaf Group and the Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Figiriers, Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS)-identified local terrorist groups, and foreign terrorists that "they are closely monitoring," and extortion activities of leftists groups, such as the Communist Party of the Philippines, New People's Army and National Democratic Front, the two military officials noted.

## Troops seize Abu Sayyaf encampant in Basilan province

Government troops seized an Abu Sayyaf encampment on a remote hilltop in Sumisip town in the troubled province of Basilan where security forces continue to pursue the notorious militant group tied to the Islamic State, officials said Saturday.

Officials said soldiers also recovered homemade bomb components left behind by militants under Puruji Indama after engaging them in a firefight. Military aircrafts, officials said, provided close air support while ground troops pounded the area with artillery fire.

Captain Jo-ann Petinglay, a spokeswoman for the Western Mindanao Command, quoting reports from army commanders in Basilan, said as many as 20 militants were killed in the clashes since May 11, but the military could not provide proofs of the claims except for information allegedly provided by civilians and former militants who surrendered to them.

Petinglay, reading from the army reports, said <u>troops discovered about a dozen makeshift tents at the encampment that could accommodate at least 40 militants.</u>

Basilan, one of 5 provinces under the Muslim autonomous region, is a stronghold of the Abu Sayyaf which has been fighting for the establishment of a caliphate in the country.

## ARMM seeks help of Islamic scholars v. terrorism

From the Mindanao Examiner (May 13): ARMM seeks help of Islamic scholars v. terrorism

The Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM) have convened around 300 Ulama (Islamic scholars) from across the country for a three-day (12-14 May) summit that aims to explore the role of Muslim scholars and religious leaders in the fight against terrorism.

ARMM Governor Mujiv Hataman said terrorists use inappropriate interpretations of Islamic principles to strengthen their cause and encourage the commission of vicious acts. "We urge our Ulama that if we are on the right position, we should move to show what is right, and let's condemn what is wrong," he said.

The Philippines ranked 12th among the countries heavily affected by terrorism in the 2016 Global Terrorism Index of the Institute for Economics and Peace, and the presence of the Abu Sayyaf Group and the Maute group, the country's leading terrorist groups, in at least two of its provinces brings the ARMM at the forefront of the fight against terrorism in the country.

The three-day "Ulama Summit Against Terrorism" is an initial step of the ARMM government to enlist the support of Islamic scholars to combat terrorism. The national government considers terrorism as an urgent and critical national security threat.

Hataman said Muslim scholars can contribute to the advocacy against terrorism by educating people about the true teachings of Islam most especially on the principles of justice, compassion, peace and harmony.

<u>Sheikh Abdulrahman "Abu Hurayra" Udasan, mufti of the Darul-Ifta Bangsamoro</u>, said that "there should be a distinction between the normative teaching on Islam that is based on the glorious Qur'an and the cultural practices of the Muslims which may or may not be consistent with the normative teaching of Islam."

He emphasized that Islam means peace "and this can automatically counter terrorism and extremism, because peace in Islam is a key of association not isolation; it is a key of accommodation not marginalization."

Aside from the Ulama, the summit is also being attended by local and regional government officials, military and police officials, representatives from civil society organizations and the media.

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#### Pangasinan police director says no NPA extortion in his area

A Pangasinan police official has disclosed that extortionists -- and not the New People's Army (NPA) -- could be behind the threatening text messages received by some people and businesses in the province, which he insisted has long been insurgency-free.

Provincial police director, Senior Supt. Ronald Oliver Lee, said the unknown senders of these text messages could be claiming that they are NPA rebels demanding revolutionary taxes, but are no more than plain extortionists.

Lee said they have investigated most of the text messages referred by the recipients to them and they have found out that these were the works of extortionists out to make some fast money from their intended victims.

"These are not actually NPA rebels but just plain extortionists using the name of the NPA," said Lee in a talk to newsmen.

He cited that in one case they investigated, they traced the sender of the text message to Mindanao, too far away from Pangasinan where the recipient lives.

Lee thus called on the public not to panic and not to give in to the demands of the extortionists.

Instead, report the matter to the police so the culprits could be identified and arrested, he said, noting that the senders of these text messages would send couriers to collect the money from the victims or send a particular address where the money could be wired through a local remittance company.

Giving in to their demands would only lead to more demands, he said, stressing that this has to stop.

### ARMM dev't key to fight vs terrorism, says military official

From the Philippine News Agency (May 13): ARMM dev't key to fight vs terrorism, says military official

A ranking military official has recognized the important roles Muslim religious leaders play in preventing the spread of Islamic extremism and terrorism in Mindanao.

Western Mindanao Command chief, Maj. Gen. Carlito Galvez, told Muslim clerics attending the "Ulama Summit Against Terrorism" that developing communities is one of the effective ways to contain extremism espoused by militants who use Islam as the basis for recruiting poor residents of the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM).

The three-day summit, which began Friday and will end Sunday, was organized by ARMM Regional Gov. Mujiv Hataman and ARMM Darui Ifta (House of Opinions).

"We are together employing different approaches towards that goal and one of the solutions we also saw fit is the continuing implementation by the ARMM government of infrastructure projects in areas where there are fanatical extremist groups," Galvez said.

He said socioeconomic developments, such as roads, seaports, and other facilities, improve poor communities and provide them sources of livelihood.

With improved communities, people will lose interest in extremism, he pointed out.

At the start of the summit, members of Muslim religious leaders and preachers expressed support for Malacañang's antiterrorism drive.

Three major extremist groups are found in the ARMM's Maguindanao, Lanao del Sur, Basilan, Sulu and Tawi-Tawi provinces.

These are the Abu Sayyaf Group, Maute Terrorist Group, and Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters (BIFF), all of whom have pledged allegiance to the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS).

Hataman said the summit seeks the support of Muslim preachers from ARMM provinces and other regions in Mindanao in preventing the entry of jihadists and extremists in their communities.

These extremists use Islam as a jumping board in recruiting young Moros to join them and promote violence, he said.

Hataman has repeatedly said that Islam means peace and it does not, and will not, promote violence against any human being.

Present during the opening program on Friday were some 300 Moro clerics, youth organizations, police and military officials, as well as provincial and regional elected officials.

Security was tight inside and outside the 10-hectare ARMM compound with six platoons of soldiers and a company of police securing the delegates.

A summit on terrorism held in Talayan town in Maguindanao last month, apparently angered the extremists, who aliegedly set off a roadside bomb at the summit's venue a day after the gathering of Muslim clerics.

Security officials have assured the ongoing event would be safe.

## Military welcomes Muslim clerics' action against terrorism

A top military official here welcomed the move of the Muslim clerics, particularly in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM), for taking an active role in the fight against terrorism.

Lt. Gen. Carlito Galvez. Jr., commander of the Western Mindanao Command (Westmincom), said there is a need for all the stakeholders to contain the spread of religious extremism and radicalism here in Mindanao.

"Security is a shared responsibility that needs sustainment of partnership between the different stakeholders, security sectors, the local government units, the academe, and religious sectors, and other stakeholders to defeat the threat of terrorism in Southern Philippines," Galvez said.

Galvez was one of the resource persons in the three-day Ulama Summit, which started on Friday in Cotabato City.

Around 300 Ulama and Ustads from all over the country attended the event which was conceptualize after Daesh groups were monitored recruiting in the different areas of Mindanao especially among the youth.

"There is a need to unite all our efforts to win the war against Islamic extremism and terrorism in our region. We must condemn all terror actions of international and local terrorist groups," Galvez said.

Alih Aiyub, secretary general of the Ulama Council of the Philippines, in a text message to the Philippines News Agency, said the Ulama should actively spread the correct teachings of Islam.

"When these terrorists are brave enough to do evil, we the Ulama are even braver to do good to prevent and counter corruption and terrorism in the land. This is our sacred duty as religious leaders," Alyub said, referring to the threat of terrorist groups against Ulama.

A radical group which calls itself as "Dawia Islamiya" issued a threat prior to the start of the summit, threatening Ulama who would attend the event.

"To those who have Ulama relatives, warn your parents, brothers and children not to attend the summit because if something happens to them along the way or in the end, don't tell us you were not warned," the statement said.

Dawla Islamiya, roughly translates to "Islamic state," is believed to have pledged allegiance to ISIS.

The group claimed that ARMM Gov. Mujiv Hataman has been using the Ulama for his personal agenda, and that the summit would result to Ulama branding members of the radical group as terrorists.

In a separate statement, Hataman noted that terrorism and security-related problems in the region had been hampering economic growth, and the support of religious leaders were pivotal to community-based initiatives towards sustainable development and against terrorism in the region.

He said that the economies of ARMM could only post less than one percent growth last year while that of the neighboring areas posted four to six percent growth. "This is because security threats pose limits in the region's economic expansion." he added,

The Ulama Summit aims to chart a policy and action plan to overcome the issues of extremism and radicalism, Aiyub said.

The summit was initiated by the Office of the Regional Governor and the Regional Darul Ifta of the ARMM.
